# **Common Interpretive Mistake:**

Confusing the thrust of these parables as pertaining to wandering sheep not spiritually dead sinners.

- Parable of LOST sheep.
- Parable of the LOST coin.
- Parable of the LOST son, or sons.

# **Parable of the Lost Sheep Story Line:**

God seeks the non-believing, unsaved, sinner as the shepherd does the lost sheep. He's glad for the ninety saved but grieves for the unregenerate, unbelieving sinner who still needs salvation (Luke 15:4-7).

# **Parable of the Lost Coin Story Line:**

God stands ready, willing, and able to sweep aside the sin of the lost person with the blood of Christ and the grace of God like the woman who sweeps the room in search of a single coin. The coin didn't wander away for a while---it was lost. (Luke 15:8-10)

# Parable of the Lost (Prodigal) Son Story Line:

And the prodigal son is a non-believer whom his own father saw as dead. This son rejected his father, his family, his upbringing, and his religion, squandering his inheritance God stands ready, willing, and able to forgive, redeem, and save as soon as that individual repents of their sin and turns to Him by faith. (Luke 15:10-32).

Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living. (Luke 15:13)



And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need. <sup>15</sup> So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. <sup>16</sup> And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything. (Luke 15:14-16)

# Profile of a prodigal

He deliberately does what he does (Luke 15:12).

She does not <u>think</u> of the well-being or needs of others (Luke 15:13-14a).

He will do almost <u>anything</u> to get what he wants (Luke 15:12, 15).

<sup>12</sup> And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them. <sup>15</sup> So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs.



They <u>love</u> themselves above God, parents and siblings (Luke 15:13).

<sup>13</sup> Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living.

She demands to be <u>accommodated</u> (Luke 15:12b).

'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.'



He is at risk, eternally speaking (Luke 15: 24, 32).

<sup>24</sup> For this my son <u>was dead</u>, and is alive again; he <u>was lost</u>, and is found.' And they began to celebrate. <sup>32</sup> It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother <u>was dead</u>, and is alive; he <u>was lost</u>, and is found.'"

WHAT CAN I DO?



Three Steps you can take to help your prodigal and your family:

Don't compromise or negotiate; instead: "do nothing" (Luke 15:12, 14, 20; 24).

<sup>12</sup> And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them. <sup>14</sup> And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, <u>and he began to be in need.</u>

Don't be <u>naïve</u>, or <u>make excuses</u> for their behavior (Luke 15:24, 32):

<sup>24</sup> For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to celebrate. <sup>32</sup> It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found.'" (Luke 15:32)

# Be <u>hopeful</u> not <u>hopeless</u> (Luke 15:20a).

<sup>20</sup> And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him.
