"Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son." (Luke 15:21)

Quick! Bring the best **robe** and put it on him. Put **a ring** on his finger and **sandals** on his feet. (Luke 15: 22)

- How does the prodigal son navigate the inner turmoil of shame and guilt upon his return, knowing he has squandered his inheritance?
- What external obstacles does the prodigal son face as he attempts to rebuild his relationship with his father and reintegrate into his community?
- How does the prodigal son confront the skepticism and resentment of those questioning the sincerity of his repentance and his father's forgiveness?
- What specific actions does the prodigal son take to demonstrate genuine remorse and a desire for reconciliation with his father?
- How does the prodigal son overcome his own pride and ego to accept the humility required to ask for forgiveness and seek love from his father?
- What emotional barriers does the prodigal son encounter in fully embracing his father's forgiveness and the unconditional love offered to him?
- In what ways does the prodigal son struggle with the fear of repeating past mistakes and falling back into his old habits, even after experiencing his father's love and forgiveness?

Prayer:

God, if you are real, make yourself real to me. Awaken in me the awareness that I am your unconditionally loved child.

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old is gone, the new is here!" -2 Corinthians 5:17)

o Your past is in the past. You are a new creation. You are home!

"In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins..." –Ephesians 1:7)

- O Your sins have been forgiven. Your record is clean. You are home! "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus... Romans 8:1)
- You are not condemned. Bye, bye, shame! You are home!
 "...nothing in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God..." Romans
 8:39)
 - You can never be separated from God's love. You are home!
 - "So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith..." Galatians 3:26)
 - o You are God's child. You will always be God's child. You are home!
