- Evaluate the impact of spiritual maturity on the unity and effectiveness of a church, drawing from Ephesians 4:13-15. How does personal spiritual growth influence the collective growth of the body of Christ?
- Reflect on Ephesians 4:16 and discuss practical ways believers can actively participate in the growth and strengthening of their church. How can individuals contribute beyond attending services?
- How does the concept of diversity in spiritual gifts, as discussed in Ephesians 4:7-12, contribute to the richness and vitality of a church community? Share examples of how different gifts complement one another.
- Explore the connection between individual character traits (humility, gentleness, patience, love) mentioned in Ephesians 4:1-3 and the effective functioning of the

body of Christ. How can personal growth in these areas enhance community cohesion and mission outreach?
