5) The danger of <u>Asceticism</u> - which called for harsh treatment of the BODY as the means to control its lusts (2:20-23).

Listen to Paul's heart for these believers in 2:1-7.

9 practical ways...

- 1) Set Your Mind on Things **Above** (3:1-4)
- 2) Put Off the *Old* Man (3:5-9)
- 3) Put On the *New* Man (3:10-14)
- 4) Allow God's **Word** to Change You (3:15-16)
- 5) Live Your Live *Everyday* for Jesus (3:17)
- 6) Make Your *Family* a Priority (3:18-4:1)
- 7) Devote Yourself to <u>Prayer</u> (4:2-4)
- 8) Walk in God's <u>Wisdom</u> (4:5)
- 9) Guard Your <u>Speech</u> (4:6)

Paul ends his letter by Commending his Fellow Messengers (4:7-9) and Sending Greetings from His Friends (4:10-14).

I. THE **CITY** OF COLOSSAE

The city was located about 100 miles east of Ephesus in Asia Minor (modern day Turkey).

Together with Hieropolis (4:13) and Laodicea (2:1; 4-13-16; Revelation 3:14-22), Colosse made up a tri-city area.

It was predominantly a pagan city but had a strong intermingling of Jews.

II. THE AUTHOR

The apostle Paul, joins with Timothy in his salutation.

(1:1; 4:18)

III. THE **CHURCH** AT COLOSSE

The establishment of the church is uncertain.

We don't know if Paul himself ever visited there.

(Acts 18:23; Acts 19:1; Colossians 2:1; Colossians 1:5-8; Colossians 4:12-13)

IV. THE TIME AND PLACE OF WRITING

Colossians is one of Paul's four "PRISON EPISTLES" (4:18; cf. Ephesians, Philippians, and Philemon) written while he was imprisoned at Rome.

(Acts 28:16; Acts 28:30-31)

If that's the case, then Paul wrote Colossians around 61-63 A.D. from Rome.

V. THE <u>THEME</u> OF THE EPISTLE

The theme of this letter is The PRE-EMINENCE of JESUS, the CHRIST (Colossians 1:18).

(Colossians 2:9-10)

## VI. THE **OUTLINE** OF THE LETTER

Colossians can easily be divided into two sections.

1. The IMPORTANCE of CHRISTIAN <u>DOCTRINE</u> (1-2)

In 1:1-2 Paul introduces himself along with Timothy...

He also reveals his ministry to them... (1:24-29)

He also compliments the Colossian believers for their growing faith (1:3-8)

For the most part Paul's response to them was favourable...(2:5)

Beginning in verse 9 Paul tells them he is praying for them...

Paul then introduces the theme of his letter to them as he declares the PRE-EMINENCE of CHRIST... (3 truths)...

- 1) Christ is pre-eminent over <u>Creation</u> (15-17)
- 2) Christ is pre-eminent in the <u>Church</u> (18)...
- 3) Christ is pre-eminent because of the <u>Cross</u> (19-20)...

The subject matter of chapters 1-2, especially chapter two, strongly suggests that the church was facing several doctrinal dangers.

There are five issues Paul addresses with them in what is often called...

## "The Colossian Heresy"

The danger of...

- 1) Relapse into <u>Paganism</u> with its gross immorality (1:21-23; 2:6; 3:5-11)
- 2) The danger of accepting the <u>Philosophies</u> of MEN which denied the all sufficiency and preeminence of Christ. (2:8)
- 3) The danger of the influence of the <u>Judaizers</u>

  This was the group who attached special significance to the rite of circumcision, food

regulations, and observance of special days. (2:11; 2:16-17)

4) The danger of <u>Angel</u> worship

...which detracted from the UNIQUENESS of Christ (2:18)
