# **Motivation (Why They Need to Know It)**

What were the reasons for Paul's writing?

- To confront false teachers who had infiltrated the church (1 Timothy 1)
- To establish proper conduct in the churches at Ephesus (circular letter)
  Prayer; Proper behavior of men and women; Proper leadership (elders/deacons)

# Information (What They Need to Know)

# Three Questions about the Office of Deacon...

#### What is a deacon?

Acts 6:1 (NLT) But as the believers rapidly multiplied, there were rumblings of discontent. The Greek-speaking believers complained about the Hebrew-speaking believers, saying that their [Greek-speaking] widows were being discriminated against in the daily distribution of food. 2 So the Twelve called a meeting of all the believers. They said, "We apostles should spend our time teaching the word of God, not running a food program [serve tables]. 4 Then we apostles can spend our time in prayer and teaching the word."

- *Deacon* is the Greek word *diakonos*, meaning servant or a waiter
- Those who serve the needs of the church family, especially concerning food and monetary needs (they focus on physical, mental, financial needs within the church) *Finance Team; North Canton Cares Food Pantry; Ministry Leaders*
- Those who free up the pastors to be able to pray and teach the Word

# Who can be a deacon?

Acts 6:3 (NLT) "And so, brothers, select seven men who are well respected and are full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will give them this responsibility. 4 Then we apostles can spend our time in prayer and teaching the word."

- Those the congregation "pushes forward" because they serve above and beyond
- Those confirmed by the pastors in response to the congregation
- Those qualified men or women

**1 Timothy 3:11 (ESV)** Their wives *[women]* likewise must be dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things.

Considerations for women deacons...

- Phoebe was considered a deacon (*servant* is the same Greek word for deacon)
  Romans 16:1 (ESV) I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a <u>servant</u> [*deaconess*] of the church...
- Likewise (3:11) means women are serving in the same way as men
- Qualifications for deacons are similar for both men and women
- The word *wives* can also mean *women*
- If this is referring to qualifications of the deacons' wives, why weren't qualifications given for pastors' wives?
- Deacons don't teach, so this doesn't contradict earlier teaching

# What are the qualifications of a deacon?

- Dignified (respectable and reverent)
- Not double-tongued (speaks trustworthy words)
- Not addicted to much wine (no reputation as a drinker; judgment isn't impaired)
- Not greedy for dishonest gain (content with what he possesses)
- Hold the mystery of faith with a good conscience (commitment to uphold the truth of the Scriptures)
- Proven blameless (no glaring sin; watched over by pastors)
- Husband of one wife (one-woman man)
- Good manager of his own home
