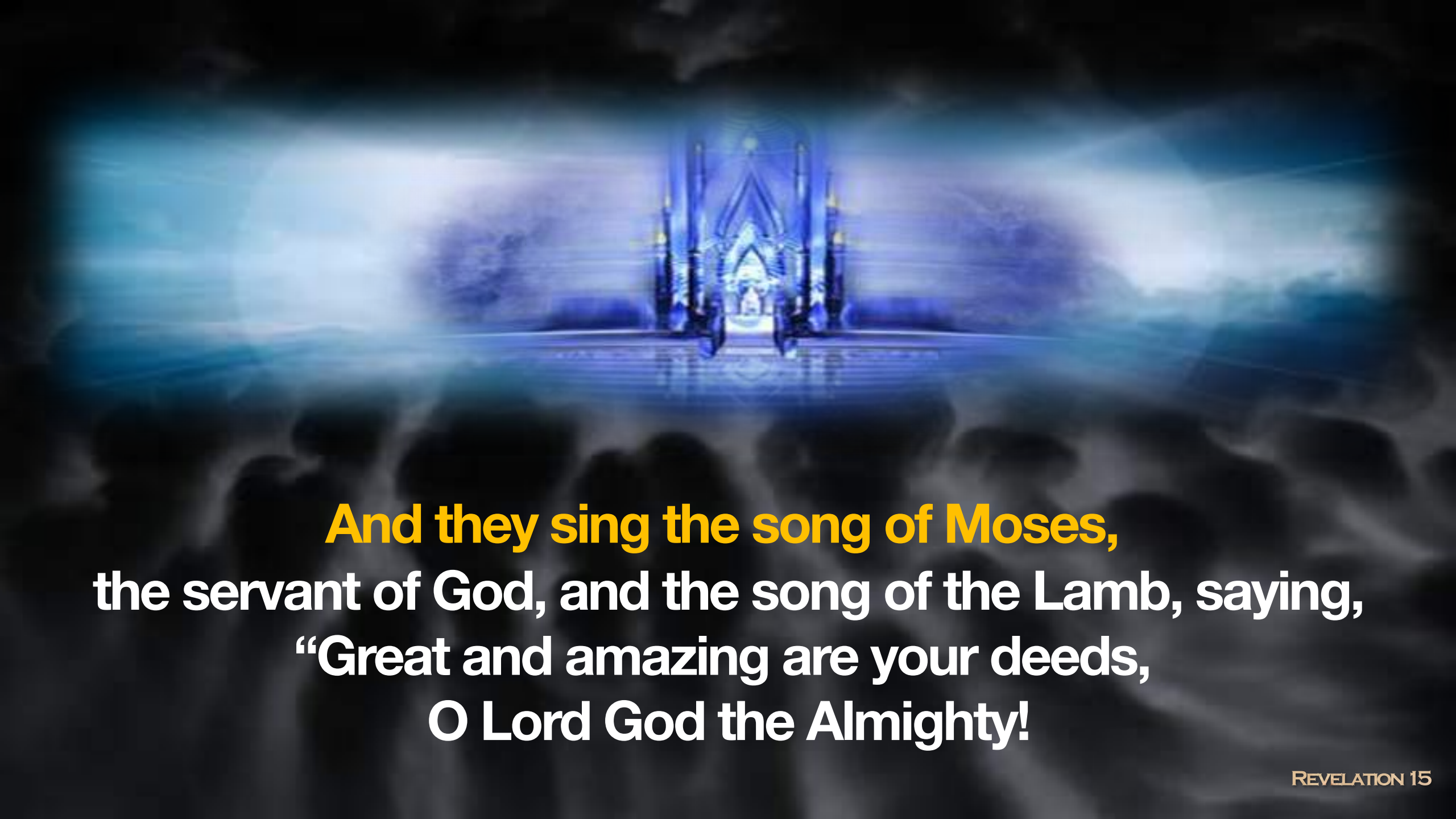

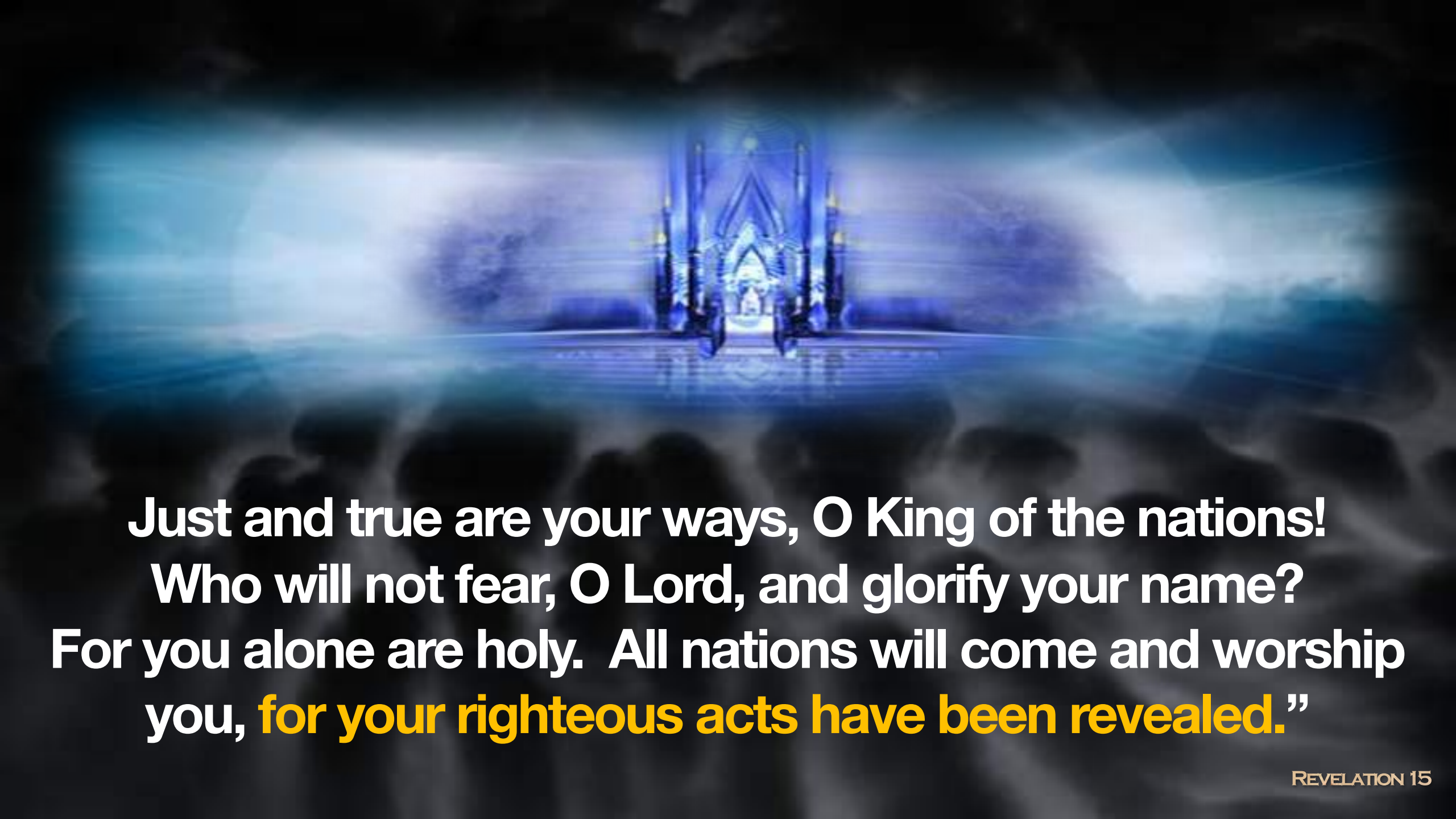
Then I saw another sign in heaven, great and amazing, **seven angels with seven plagues**, which are the last, for with them the wrath of God is finished.

O Lord God the Almighty!



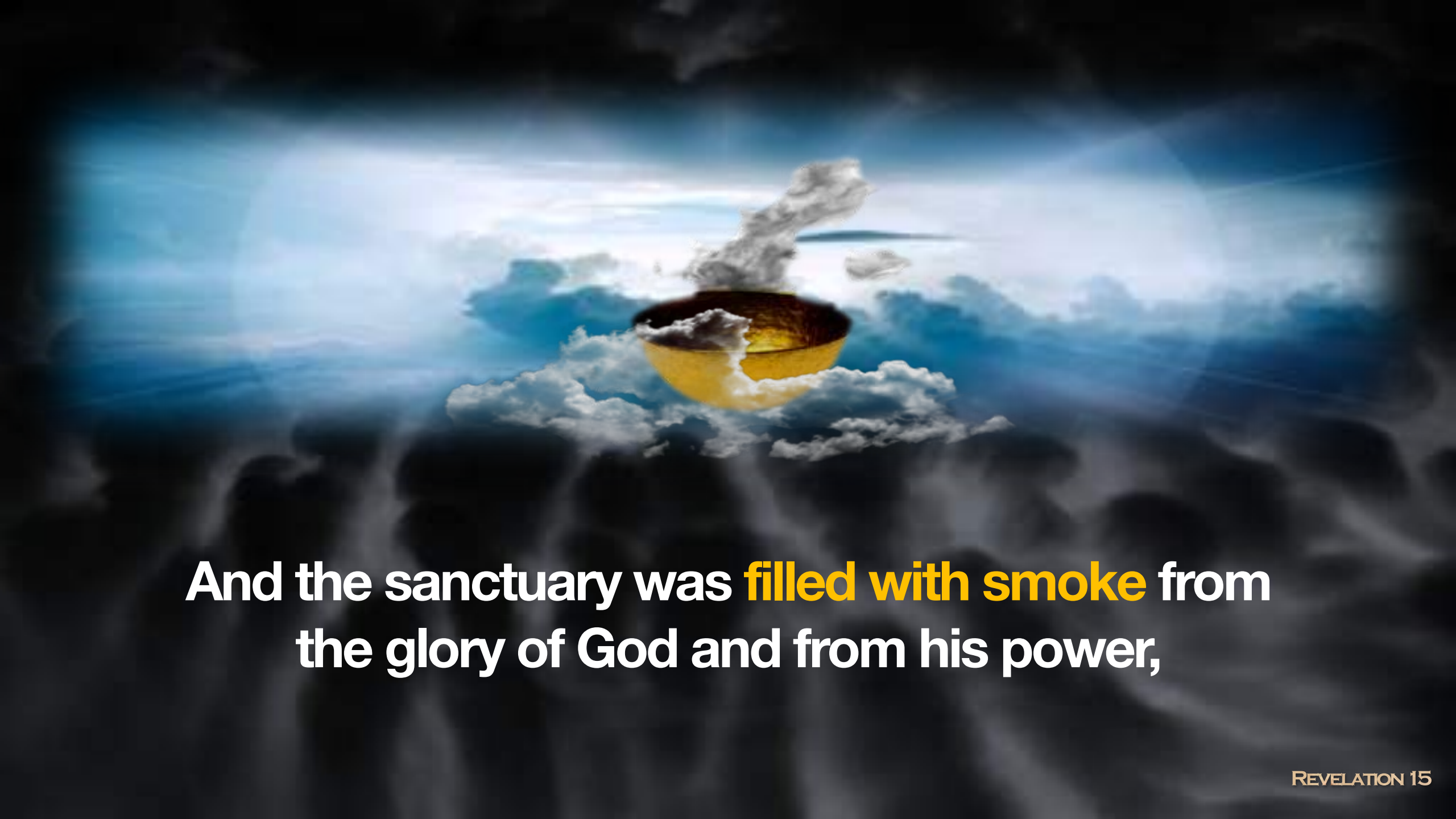
**Just and true are your ways, O King of the nations!

you, **for your righteous acts have been revealed.**”**



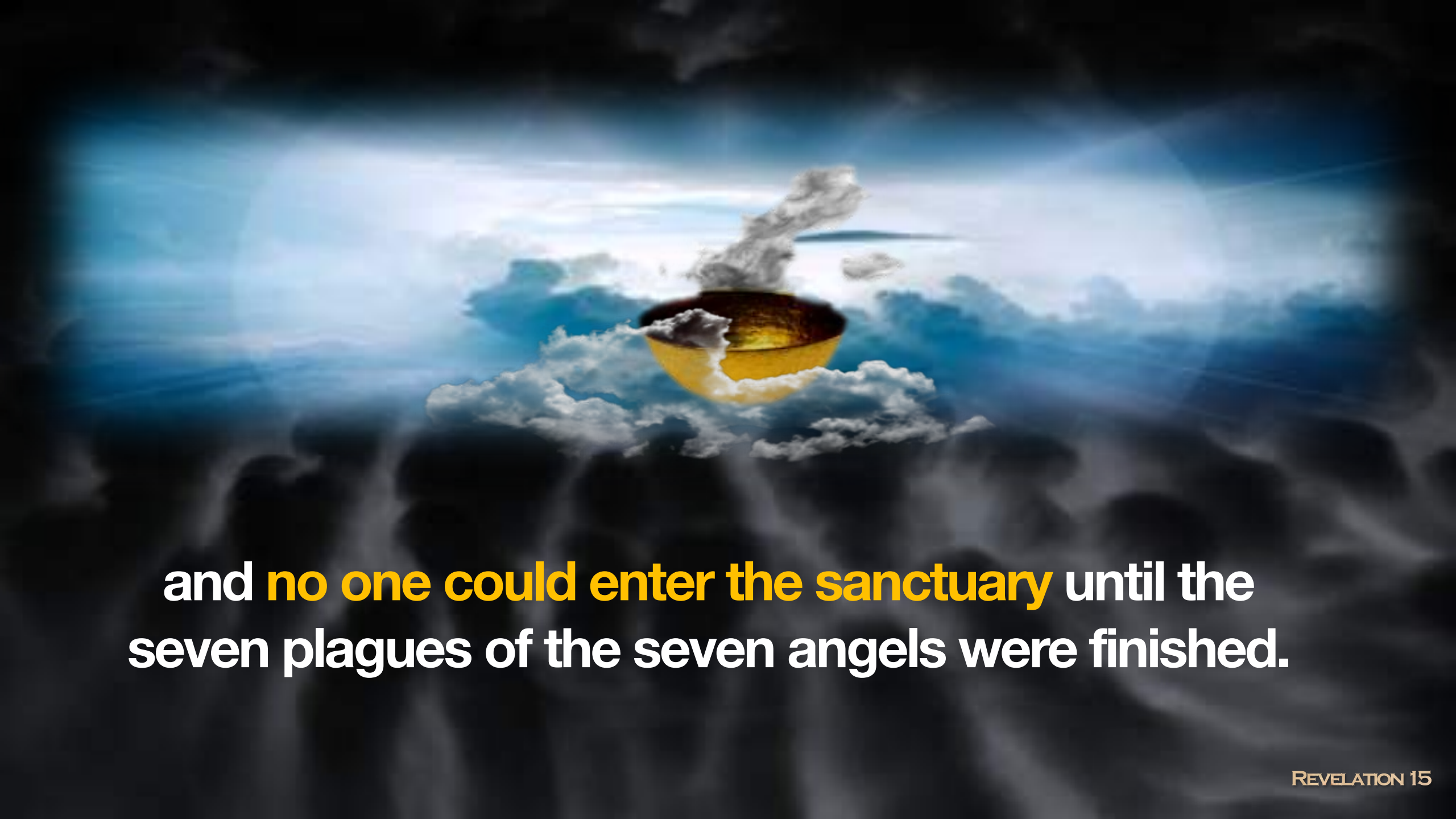

the almighty.


