MESSAGE INTRODUCTION

What does it mean to be a healthy, Spirit-filled church when it comes to prophecy? In his message this week called **Healthy Prophecy**, Pastor Matt dives deep into the

gift of prophecy. Are we really hearing the voice of God or something else? How are those prophesying held accountable? Is the prophetic word rooted in the Word? Does this prophetic word build up the church or the one giving the word? Let's see what Matt has to say about this and much, much more.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS (35-45 min)

- 1. Last week you were asked to take some time to pray for the sick. Who did the Holy Spirit bring to your mind for you to pray for?
- 2. What is something that jumped out at you from Matt's message this week?
- 3. When have you seen prophecy done well? When have you seen it not done well? What was the gap between the two?
- 4. "Do not quench the Spirit; do not despise prophetic utterances. But examine everything carefully; hold fast to that which is good; abstain from every form of evil." 1 Thessalonians 5:19-22

Why do you think Paul was directed to write, "do not despise" prophetic utterances? What does it look like to "examine everything carefully" or "test everything" regarding prophecy? How do we determine what is "good" in that context?

5. Read 1 Corinthians 14:1-5 together. What do you notice? What's the primary point of prophecy? How does that differ from or align with what you've seen modeled in prophecy in your life?

- 6. Have you ever received an incredibly impactful prophetic word? What made it impactful? What was the outcome or fruit?
- 7. "To him the doorkeeper opens, and the sheep hear his voice, and he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he puts forth all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. A stranger they simply will not follow, but will flee from him, because they do not know the voice of strangers..... I have other sheep, which are not of this fold; I must bring them also, and they will hear My voice; and they will become one flock with one shepherd.... My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me;" John 10:3-5, 16, 27

Jesus makes it clear that His sheep can hear His voice. He presents it as a completely natural part of belonging to Him. How does this challenge what you've believed? How does it comfort you? When do you feel like you've heard Him the clearest?

8. If every believer can hear from God, why prophecy? Why would God speak through someone else for your life in this way? Have you ever had a word confirm something through someone else that He's already spoken to you?

APPLICATION

Do you believe in the gift of prophecy? Have you ever received a word from God through someone else? What did you do? How did you react? Have you ever received a word from God for someone else and spoke that work to them? How did that go? Spend some time this week thinking about the gift of prophecy and how it can be done "right" or "wrong".
