PRAYER/MINISTRY TIME (20-30 min)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS (35-45 min)

- 1. Last week we were challenged to get back to the basics of the faith and really know the Bible and who God so we can discern heresy when we come across it. What did you do this past week to get back to the basics and really lean in and learn about who Christ is?
- 2. What was one thing that really stood out to you from the message this week?
- 3. What does the world seem to think peace means? How does that differ from biblical peace? How should biblical peace look in the life of a Christian?
- 4. Why do you think Jesus asks the Samaritan woman for a drink of water? (Remember the Jews despised the Samaritans and the idea of a Jewish man talking to a Samaritan woman was unthinkable). What are some of the reasons you think this was important for Jesus to do? Are there areas in our own lives where we might be able to use Jesus' example to reach out to others? What are some of those ways?
- 5. After Jesus confronts the woman with her life situation, she quickly changes the subject to take the focus off of her. Do we sometimes find ourselves like this woman when we become convicted of something in our life? Do you have an example of a time when you tried to deflect things and change the subject when confronted by the Holy Spirit?

APPLICATION

Think about your own life and all the ways you seek for and try to obtain peace. What are those ways? When you look at those ways, does Jesus find his way into the list? Be honest. If so, where does he rank? Are there changes that need to be made?
