MESSAGE INTRODUCTION

This week we continue our sermon series on the Fruit of the Spirit. In Matt's message this week on the fruit of Kindness, we learn that niceness and kindness, though often used interchangeably, are not the same thing. Let's

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS (35-45 min)

- 1. Last week you were asked to try the waiting exercise Matt demonstrated at the end of his message.
 - Sit up straight and relaxed.
 - Wait.
 - Pay attention to your body and surroundings. Do you feel anything? Do you see or notice anything?
 - Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to come?
 - Wait. Keep paying attention and looking.

Did you have the chance to try it? Did you feel or notice anything while you were doing this?

- 2. Was there anything that jumped out at you from Matt's message this week?
- 3. As Matt went through verse 7 of the text, it might have been different from how you've read or thought about that verse. Matt said a better translation of the original Hebrew would be "The Lord is merciful to thousands and punishes only 3 or 4". What do you think about this change? What does it do to your idea of generational curses?
- 4. At the end of his message, Matt went through the chart below. Take a few minutes in your group and talk about niceness versus kindness.
