already been given unity through the Trinity and see how it is to be lived out in our lives. Paul encourages the Ephesians to preserve the unity that has already been given to them. Let's dive in and see how this applies to us today.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS (35-45 min)

- 1. Last week you were asked to reflect on the identity you've already been given in Christ. (Remember, it's nothing you must strive to achieve. It has already been given to you.) As you settled into that identity, did you find that you were living according to the calling you've already been given or if you're chasing the next big thing. Share with your group what you came up with.
- 2. What is something that jumped out to you from Grant's message this week?
- 3. How is it a sign of maturity if we go after reconciliation quickly? What might that look like in our life?
- 4. In this passage from Ephesians we are asked to be brought into the unity of the Trinity. (Previously we were asked to experience and be part of the love expressed by the Trinity). What is the unity of the Trinity? What is it supposed to look like?
- 5. We are not creating or producing unity. We have already been given unity and are invited to preserve what we already have. How does this seem to be at odds with our efforts many times to "create unity" in our lives and church?

6. "If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at peace with all men." (Romans 12:18). Do you think there are times when we don't do what is required of us to be at peace? We are waiting on others when the responsibility for peace might be up to us?

APPLICATION

Where do you need to seek out reconciliation and unity this week? Ask the Holy Spirit to show you where and how you need to seek reconciliation and then go out and do it. Consider sharing with your group next week.
