#### MESSAGE INTRODUCTION

life and teachings of Jesus. Let's dive in and explore what it means to be loved, and to love.

# **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS (35-45 min)**

- 1. Last week you were asked to reflect and see if you were living a life in the Spirit or in the Flesh. Did anything come to you from your reflection? This is a perfect time to allow yourself to be open and vulnerable to your group and share with them.
- 2. Was there something that really jumped out at you from the message this week?
- 3. The imposter of kindness is being nice. The imposter of love is tolerance. What do you think about these statements? How are tolerance and love at odds with each other? (Hint: one is inward focused and the other is focused outward). What does the world say about love and tolerance? How does what the world says hold up to the Truth?
- 4. Read Luke 19:1-7. What do we learn about love from this story of Zacchaeus? How did Jesus show love to Zacchaeus? Do you think you would have reacted the same way Jesus did? Why or why not?
- 5. "Jesus' love is neither permissive nor conditional. It expects and enables obedience but doesn't require obedience as its prerequisite". What do you think about this statement? Are there times when our love requires a prerequisite?

## **APPLICATION**

We are called to elevate love in our lives. We are called to love people like Jesus loves them? Think of the people you encounter every day. Do you love them like Jesus loves them? Are there people you find it difficult to love? Ask God to bring them to mind and then pray for God to change **you** so you can love even those who are difficult to love. Share with your group next week.
