THE FALL OF SATAN

Ezekiel 28:12-19; Luke 10:17; Isaiah 14:12-14

GENESIS 3 CHART (on back)

Genesis 3:6

Eve's deception took three forms:

- *That the tree was good for food appealed to her physical appetite
 - -an illicit appetite provoked by a selfish discontent and a distrust of God.
- *That it was pleasant to the eyes excited her emotional appetite
 - -as covetousness grew in her heart, the forbidden fruit looked better and better.
- *That the fruit was desirable to make one wise provoked her intellectual appetite
- -she desired knowledge and was tempted by the false promise that it would make her like God. "It was not overt rebellion against God, but seduction and deception to make her believe her act was the right thing to do." (From John MacArthur's Commentary on Genesis 3:6)

CONSEQUENCES OF SIN

For Adam & Eve

- *Their innocence was lost.
- *Fellowship with God was lost.
- *Marriage and fellowship between husband and wife was forever changed.

For the serpent

- *Physical serpent was cursed and would have to crawl on his belly and eat dust.
- *Spiritual serpent (Satan) would bruise the <u>heel</u> of the woman's offspring, but he would be bruised in the <u>head</u> by her offspring.

For the woman & marriage

- *She will bear children in pain.
- *Her desire will be for her husband and he will rule over her.

For the man

*He will work for his food by the sweat of his face.

For creation

- *The ground will bring forth thorns and thistles.
- *All creation will be in bondage to corruption (Romans 8:20-22).

DEATH

- *Physical death for all people.
- *Spiritual death for those who are not in Christ.
- *Eternal separation from God in the lake of fire (Revelations 20:14).
