

5-Day Devotional: The Risen King



Day 1: Remembering What Jesus Said

Reading: [Luke 24:1-9](#); [John 14:1-6](#)

Devotional: The women at the tomb were confused because they forgot what Jesus had promised. In our moments of crisis, we often do the same—we forget His words of comfort, provision, and presence. Jesus spent His earthly ministry preparing His disciples for what was to come, yet when the moment arrived, they were unprepared. This week, commit to remembering what Jesus has said. Write down scriptures that speak to your current situation. When anxiety threatens, recall His promise: "Let not your heart be troubled." When you feel alone, remember: "I will never leave you nor forsake you." Faith isn't just knowing what Jesus said—it's remembering it when life challenges that truth. Your breakthrough begins with remembering His Word.

Day 2: Evidence All Around Us

Reading: [Romans 1:18-20](#); [Psalm 19:1-6](#)

Devotional: The disciples had overwhelming evidence of Jesus' power—water turned to wine, blind eyes opened, Lazarus raised from death. yet they still doubted His resurrection. How often do we do the same? God has filled your life with evidence of His faithfulness: breath in your lungs, provision for your needs, answered prayers, and divine protection. Creation itself testifies to His existence and power. Today, take inventory of God's faithfulness in your life. Write down three specific ways God has shown up for you recently. When doubt creeps in, return to this evidence. You don't need more proof; you need to acknowledge the proof already present. Let the evidence of His past faithfulness fuel your faith for present challenges.

Day 3: Your Personal Experience

Reading: [John 20:24-29](#); [1 Peter 2:1-3](#)

Devotional: Thomas needed a personal encounter before he would believe. While we honor the faith of our parents and spiritual mentors, secondhand faith will crumble under pressure. You need your own experience with the Risen King. God doesn't want you depending solely on your pastor's relationship with Him or your grandmother's prayers—He wants His own relationship with you. Today, pursue a personal encounter with God. Spend time in His presence without distractions. Ask

Him to reveal Himself to you in fresh ways. When you have your own testimony, no one can argue you out of your faith. Your personal experience with God becomes unshakeable evidence that transforms belief from intellectual agreement to confident conviction. Seek Him for yourself today.

Day 4: The Power of Resurrection

Reading: Ephesians 1:15-23; Romans 8:11

Devotional: The same power that raised Jesus from the dead is available to you today. Resurrection power isn't just historical—it's present and active in believers' lives. What needs to be resurrected in your life? Dead dreams? A cold heart? Broken relationships? Financial hope? The Risen King specializes in bringing life to dead situations. Paul prayed that believers would understand "the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe." This isn't ordinary power—it's resurrection power. Today, identify one area where you need God's resurrection power. Stop trying to revive it in your own strength. Invite the Holy Spirit to breathe new life into that dead place. The tomb is empty because death couldn't hold Him, and nothing in your life is too dead for His power to resurrect.

Day 5: Living as Evidence

Reading: 2 Corinthians 3:1-3; Matthew 5:14-16

Devotional: You are a living letter, evidence of the Risen King to a watching world. Many people won't read the Bible, but they will read your life. Your transformation—from who you were to who you're becoming in Christ—serves as proof that Jesus is alive and active. The greatest evangelism isn't perfect arguments; it's a changed life. When people see authentic transformation, they witness resurrection power. Today, consider: does your life provide evidence of the Risen King? Your peace in chaos, love toward enemies, and joy despite circumstances all testify to His resurrection. You cannot save anyone, but you can live in such a way that others want what you have. Let your life be a testimony that points others to the empty tomb and the living Christ who changed everything.
