His disciples did not understand these things at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things were written about Him and that they had done these things to Him. –NKJV

As Jesus rode into Jerusalem, He understood that His time on earth was coming to a close. 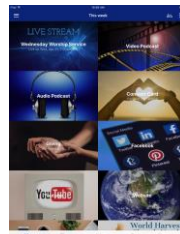

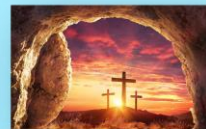
