Weekly Parent Cues

ENGAGE IN EVERYDAY MOMENTS TOGETHER



Morning Time

As your kid starts their day, encourage them that they can do big things with God's help.



Meal Time

At a meal this week, have everyone at the table answer this question: "What is something big you have to do or need to do? How can God help you with it?"



Drive Time

While on the go, ask your kid: "What is something you tried to do by yourself and you realized you needed help?" (Reinforce the idea that there's nothing wrong in asking for help—from God or from others.)



Bed Time

Pray for each other: "God, You know what big things we are facing, or will face soon. Give us the confidence to always remember that You are always with us and always willing to help us."
