Matthew 6:19, 31-33 - 19 "Don't store up treasures here on earth, where moths eat them and rust destroys them, and where thieves break in and steal... 31 "So don't worry about these things, saying, 'What will we eat? What will we drink? What will we wear?' 32 These things dominate the thoughts of unbelievers, but your heavenly Father already knows all your needs. 33 Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need.







1 Thessalonians 5:2-3 - 2 For you yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so comes as a thief in the night. 3 For when they say, "Peace and safety!" then sudden destruction comes upon them...





The truth: that brings "fullness" to the human soul

- 1. when a person feels **Peace** emotional contentment
- 2. when a person feels Safe physical security





John 10:1 - "Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheep pen by **the gate**, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber.









John 10:2-3 - The one who enters by **the gate** is the sheepherd of the sheep. 3 The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the **sheep listen to his voice**. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out.







John 10:4 - When he has brought out all his own, he goes on <u>ahead of them</u>, and his sheep follow him because <u>they know his voice.</u>





John 10:5 - But they will **never follow a stranger**; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice."





John 10:7-10 - 7 Therefore Jesus said again, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. 8 All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. 9 I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and go out, and find pasture. 10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.







John 10:11 - "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.

## TYPES OF FASTING

#### **FULL FAST**

Drink only liquids (you establish the number of days).

#### THE DANIEL FAST

Eat no meat, no sweets and no bread. Drink water and juice. Eat fruits and vegetables.

#### 3-DAY FAST

This fast can be a Full Fast, Daniel Fast or give up at least one item of food.

#### PARTIAL FAST

A partial fast is from 6:00 am to 3:00 pm or from sun up to sundown. You can select from three types of fasting —a Full Fast, Daniel Fast or give up at least one item of food.

#### PICK A MEAL TO FAST

Select a meal a day that you will fast and spend that time seeking God.

#### **MEDIA FAST**

Stay off of social media platforms or other forms of entertainment and spend the time that would be spent on those with God.


