

MAIN POINT

The church exists to carry Christ's message and miracles beyond its walls.





Acts 3:1–10 (NLT) Peter and John went to the Temple one afternoon to take part in the three o'clock prayer service. As they approached the Temple, a man lame from birth was being carried in. Each day he was put beside the Temple gate—the one called the Beautiful Gate so he could beg from the people going into the Temple. When he saw Peter and John about to enter, he asked them for some money.




Acts 3:1–10 (NLT) Peter and John looked at him intently, and Peter said, "Look at us!" The lame man looked at them eagerly, expecting some money. But Peter said, "I don't have any silver or gold for you. But I'll give you what I have. In the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, get up and walk!" Then Peter took the lame man by the right hand and helped him up. And as he did, the man's feet and ankles were instantly healed and strengthened.



Acts 3:1-10 (NLT) He jumped up, stood on his feet, and began to walk! Then, walking, leaping, and praising God, he went into the Temple with them. All the people saw him walking and heard him praising God. When they realized he was the lame beggar they had seen so often at the Beautiful Gate, they were absolutely astounded.







Mindset Shift We don't attend church to find ministry... we are the church sent for ministry.



- 1. Who sits outside your "Beautiful Gate"?
 Who do you pass every week that God is prompting you to notice?
- 2. Do I see interruptions as inconveniences or invitations from God?
- 3. Would Jesus see you a religious person or are you a Good Samaritan?








Acts 8:1-4 (NLT) Saul was one of the witnesses, and he agreed completely with the killing of Stephen. A great wave of persecution began that day, sweeping over the church in Jerusalem; and all the believers except the apostles were scattered through the regions of Judea and Samaria. (Some devout men came and buried Stephen with great mourning.) But Saul was going everywhere to destroy the church. He went from house to house, dragging out both men and women to throw them into prison. But the believers who were scattered preached the Good News about Jesus wherever they went.









Acts 8:1–4 (NLT)...But the believers who were scattered preached the Good News about Jesus wherever they went.

The Greek word for "scattered" in Acts 8 is: diaspeiro The same root as: to sow seed.



Acts 8:1–4 (NLT)...But the believers who were scattered preached the Good News about Jesus wherever they went.

The word "preached" (euangelizō) means: "to announce good news."



Mindset Shift he world pushes again

When the world pushes against us... God pushes His message through us.

- 2. Am I viewing pressure as punishment or as planting?






Acts 8:5–8 (NLT) Philip, for example, went to the city of Samaria and told the people there about the Messiah. Crowds listened intently to Philip because they were eager to hear his message and see the miraculous signs he did. Many evil spirits were cast out, screaming as they left their victims; and many who had been paralyzed or lame were healed. So there was great joy in that city.





Mindset Shift The Gospel isn't just for people like us... it's for people God loves.

- 2. How can you "as the church" intentionally reach people outside your circle?
