I Ordinary Moments Are Full Of Opportunities - 3:1-5

- A. Several ordinary things are happening here: 3:1-5
 - 1. Peter and John are going to the temple to pray.
 - 2. A crippled man from birth is being brought in to beg.
- B. Two ordinary events that become
 - 1. Divinely appointed intersections
 - 2. Divinely appointed interactions.
- C. Start to notice opportunities to speak Jesus to right where you are.
 - 1. What are our ordinary moments?
 - 2. What are the ordinary places you go where opportunities may be right in front of you?
- D. Where ever you find yourself. Whoever you find yourself with, see it as an opportunity to for God to use you to touch a life.
 - 1. What do we see? people needing Jesus
 - 2. What do we share? the gospel
 - 3. How do we get to spiritual conversation? Like they did. Kindness, encouragement, courtesy
 - a. As the apostle Paul wrote *Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near.* (Phil 4:5).
 - b. See ordinary moments in your life as opportunity to speak life, to encourage, to provide comfort, support, extend an invite, and share Jesus.
 - 4. We never know, where the moments may lead us.
- E. Many time ordinary opportunities lead to extraordinary moments. In this case there were three.

II Extraordinary Opportunity #1: A Life is Changed - 3:6-10

- A. A life was changed when...
 - 1. Truth and life are spoken 3:6
 - 2. Touch and help were extended and accepted 3:7a
 - 3. The Lord healed 3:7b -

- B. The extraordinary moments in which the Lord involves us ...
 - 1. May not be this publically dramatic or quick, but they are no less powerful.
 - 2. If you've ever been used by God to share the gospel, touch and help a life, and see the healing that takes place, you know that it is no less powerful and dramatic.
- C. The result
 - 1. God was glorified 3:8
 - 2. People were amazed 3:9-10

III Extraordinary Opportunity #2: The Gospel Is Proclaimed - 3:11-16

- A. What started as an act of kindness shown to someone who couldn't walk, turned into a full blown opportunity speak the gospel to a crowd.
- B. What started as a normal hour of prayer became a moment to hear the gospel.
- C. God can take what we see as simple and create a spiritual opportunity.
- D. Moments are there...
 - 1. Ask the Lord for eyes to see the moments.
 - 2. When the doors are open have the boldness to walk through them.

IV Extraordinary Opportunity #3: Boldness and Courage Are Regained And Gained- 4:1-22

- A. What started as an attempt to intimidate was transformed into a moment of boldness and courage. 4:1-12
- B. This is a special moment for Peter.
 - 1. Just a few months before he declares his allegiance, ask to have prominence in his kingdom, and denies he ever knew him.
 - 2. After the resurrection, he appears a bit sheepish. We see the interaction of restoration in John 21.
 - 3. We see him in Acts 2 proclaiming Jesus. The momentum is gaining.
 - 4. Now he is before the same people that killed Jesus and he doesn't back down this time.
 - 5. Boldness and courage are regained for Peter. It's amazing what a resurrected Lord and Holy Spirit filled disciple who is forgiven.
 - a. Don't let your past denials and failure steal your boldness of sharing Jesus. You are forgiven and restored by a resurrected Lord and filled and empowered with the Holy Spirit.
 - b. We are in a great company of deniers and doubters that spoke with courage and boldness.

- C. How did they get there? 4:13
 - 1. Spending time with Jesus builds this courage and boldness.
 - 2. Their sharing wasn't rehearsed.
 - 3. They could have not predicted this moment would happen. It was who they were.
 - 4. Jesus told them they when the time came they would know what to say (Mark 13:11).
- D. The threat 4:14-18 (Read 18) Don't speak any more in the name of Jesus.
 - 1. Threats to the gospel are not new.
 - 2. Unfortunately this is the norm for many of our brothers and sisters around the world.
 - 3. The gamut is wide. From avoidance, ridicule or negativity about the Christ, to deranged people who kill Christians and think they are doing the right thing.
- E. The choice 4:19-22
 - 1. Chose Commitment to God over Coercion from the enemy "we will obey God"
 - 2. Chose Conviction over Compromise "we cannot help speaking..."
- F. Not just a moment for Peter. It was a moment for all believers. Boldness and courage are contagious.
 - 1. This boldness and courage would create a momentum that would continue. Set a precedent for the future
 - 2. Historically, every attempt to stop the message of Jesus has only caused it to grow.

Conclusion: (The Take Home)

- A. Multiply, disciples making disciples, still happens today.
- B. God still take ordinary people in ordinary situations and turns them into extraordinary opportunities.
 - 1. In our Jerusalem locally
 - 2. In our Judea state and region
 - 3. In our Samaria our nations
 - 4. In our world One Kingdom Partners in every part of the world the world.
 - 5. We are especially blessed with an active and vibrant live stream community that touches lives all through their Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria.

- 1. Spend time with Jesus. Ordinary and routine moments with Jesus have an extraordinary change in your life. Quiet times alone and times with other believers.
- 2. Pray for eyes to see the ordinary opportunities to share Jesus.
- 3. Share Jesus. He is the one who has the power to transform a life.
- 4. Be bold and brave. The enemy wants to intimidate.
- 5. When we do this, people will take note that we have been with Jesus.
- 6. Give God the glory.
