# Forever Family That Walks In The Fear of The Lord Acts 2:43

### **Introduction:**

- B. Preparing to preach or teach...
- C. Acts 2:43 Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles.

# I "everyone was filled with awe" 2:43a

- A. This translation does a great job of hitting one aspect of the meaning of this text.
  - 1. However, there is a great depth to the implications of this verse
  - Different translations:
    - a. ESV/ASV: And awe (fear) came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles.
    - b. NASB: Everyone kept feeling a sense of awe; and many wonders and signs were taking place through the apostles.
    - c. NKJV Then fear came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles.
- B. "was filled" ginomai" -
  - 1. Means "come upon"
  - 2. The tense indicates a continual or repeated action.
  - 3. Literally kept coming upon them
- C. "With awe" phobos
  - 1. It's where we get our word phobia. Generally translated into English fear.
  - 2. Literally "fear kept coming upon them"
  - 3. Now that is a tricky phrase for us because fear is a tricky word for us.
  - 4. That's why some translations will use the word "awe" to communicate the meaning of the word *phobos* or fear in this context.
  - 5. That's why context is so important.
- D. Fear has many layers to it.

- 1. When we hear the word fear, usually negative connotations come to mind.
  - a. Being afraid, cowering, unsafe, unprotected, imminent harm.
  - b. We avoid those and try to cast those off.
- 2. However, there is an aspect of fear that is a must in our lives.
- E. There are two levels:
  - 1. Emotional state of fear and
  - 2. Fear of the Lord which is a healthy mature/maturing fear

#### **II** Emotional Fear

- A. This type of fear is built into us to be ...
  - 1. Momentary fight, flight freeze
  - 2. Situational gives us pause.
- B. The emotional state of fear becomes unhealthy and toxic when it goes from momentary and situational to the driving force in our life.
- C. We were never designed to live in that kind of fear.

# III Fear of the Lord - Healthy Mature/Maturing

- A. The fear of the Lord is to be lived in. Consider these verses
  - 1. Psa 19:9 NIV The fear of the LORD is pure, enduring forever.
  - 2. Psa 34:11 NIV Come, my children, listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the LORD.
  - 3. Pro 1:7 NIV The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge,
  - 4. Pro 9:10 NIV The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom,
  - 5. Pro 10:27 NIV The fear of the LORD adds length to life,
  - 6. Pro 14:27 NIV The fear of the LORD is a fountain of life, turning a person from the snares of death.
  - 7. Act 9:31 NIV Then the church throughout Judea, Galilee and Samaria enjoyed a time of peace and was strengthened. Living in the fear of the Lord and encouraged by the Holy Spirit, it increased in numbers.

- 8. Phil. 2:12 NIV Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed--not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence-continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling,
- B. Walking in the fear of the Lord is not walking afraid of the Lord.
- C. The fear of the Lord is characterized by...
  - 1. Faith
  - 2. Expectation
  - 3. **Awe**
  - 4. Reverence
- D. The fear of the Lord has the opposite effect of the emotional fear.
  - 1. It draws us close instead of remaining withdrawn.
  - 2. It leads to surrender instead of control and resistance.
  - It frees instead of binds.
  - 4. It opens our eyes instead of blinding.
  - 5. It drives out other fears.

# IV "many wonders and signs performed by the apostles." 2:43b

- A. The message of the gospel was accompanied by "wonders and signs"
  - 1. Wonders something extraordinary and momentous
  - 2. Signs confirmation; distinguished from something else.
- B. The signs and wonders performed by the apostles confirmed their message though different was authentic and from God.
  - 1. Healings, resurrections, speaking in other languages, people dying, prophecy, visions...
    - a. Weren't present at every instance, meeting and interaction
    - b. When they were...
      - (1)...they were undeniable and out of the ordinary
      - (2)...always included the preaching of the gospel.
  - 2. This is what Mark 16:20 is referring to when he wrote... *Then the disciples went out and preached everywhere, and the Lord worked with them and confirmed his word by the signs that accompanied it.*

- C. The result was people coming to Jesus and continuing to walking in the fear of the Lord.
- D. One of the most powerful evidence of the message of the gospel is a changed life.
  - 1. Watching that person go from dead to alive and then walking alive in the fear of the Lord is a powerful testimony to the redemptive work of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
  - 2. When people walk in the fear of the Lord...
    - a. Blind eyes are opened to see the ever increasing wonder of God's amazing grace toward us.
    - b. Blind spots are removed and we see his working in the lives of other people. Where once I was skeptical and doubtful, I am now believing and confident.
    - c. Blurred vision becomes clearer and clearer. Kingdom direction and purpose come into view. We start doing kingdom work we never saw ourselves doing.
  - 3. We get a glimpse of this transformation in the lives of some of our people. Roll video
