

Fierce Life of Deborah

"Deborah, the wife of Lappidoth, was a prophet who was judging Israel at that time. She would sit under the Palm of Deborah... in the hill country of Ephraim, and the Israelites would go to her for judgment." Judges 4:4-5 (NLT)
