1. Start now.

3. Examine my life.

3 Key Questions

- A. Where am I?
- B. Where do I want to go?
- C. How do I get there?

4. Ask Jesus to <u>TAKE CONTROL</u> of my life.

"Don't let sin control your body any longer; don't give in to its sinful desires... But give yourself completely to God -- every part of you -- to be used for His good purposes." Romans 6:12-13 (LB)

- Our Part: Invitation, Cooperation, Imitation
- God's Part: Transformation

5. Get a plan.
