

## 1 Corinthians 14:26-40 The Call To Order

- I. Introduction: Paul exhorted the Corinthians to edify the church with their spiritual gifts, and he called them to maintain order in the church by exercising restraint in certain areas.
  - A. Paul gave several instructions about speaking in tongues, prophecy, and unruly women, which were causing disruptions in the Corinthian assembly.

## II. The Call To Order (1 Cor 14:26-40).

- A. The Directive About Tongues (vv. 26-28).
  - 1. Paul called the Corinthians to place a number of restrictions on those who spoke in tongues so that there would be order and not confusion in their gatherings.
- B. The Directive About Prophecy (vv. 29-33).
  - 1. Paul said that those who prophesied were also limited to two to three persons, and they would have their teaching evaluated by those who had the gift of prophecy.
- C. The Directive About Women (vv. 34-36).
  - 1. Paul instructed the Corinthian women to be quiet because they were disrupting the services with their boisterous behavior and lack of respect for authority.
- D. The Directive About Authority (vv. 37-40).
  - 1. Paul concluded that anyone who disregarded what he said was rejecting the commandments of God and that they should be ignored by the rest of the church.
- III. Conclusion: Paul called the Corinthian church to order by giving them instructions about tongues, prophecy, women, and authority in the church.

## **Questions About: The Call To Order**

- 1. How ordered are churches supposed to be? How does God feel about order? (1 Cor 14:33) Why did the Corinthians need order badly? (1 Cor 14:26) How did Paul instruct them?
- 2. What did Paul say was happening in their church services? (1 Cor 14:26) Why was this causing confusion? What was Paul's overall principle in this chapter? (v. 26)
- 3. What four limitations did Paul place on speaking in tongues? (1 Cor 14:27-28) How many people were allowed to speak in tongues? (v. 27) Why did they need to speak in turn? (v. 27)
- 4. Why did Paul say that they needed an interpreter? (1 Cor 14:5, 13, 27-28) What did Paul say they should do if there was no interpreter? (v. 28) Why did Paul tell them to keep silent?
- 5. What limitations did Paul place on prophecy? (1 Cor 14:29-33) Who was to judge their prophesying? (v. 29) What was Paul's main emphasis on this gift? (v. 33)
- 6. What instruction did Paul give to the women at Corinth? (1 Cor 14:34-36) Why were they to be silent? (v. 34) Why did Paul tell them to ask their husbands if they had questions? (v. 35)
- 7. How did Paul claim to have divine authority on these matters? (1 Cor 14:36-37) What did he say to do if someone disregarded the Lord's commands? (v. 37) Why was this significant?
- **8.** What were Paul's final commands to the church? (1 Cor 14:39-40) What was the main idea of this chapter? (v. 40) How well do you submit to God's commands? Why is it difficult?

- 1. Ask God to reveal to you how you might be used to help edify the church with your gifts.
- 2. Ask God to show you how you can best help to bring order and harmony to the church.
