Hebrews 11:1-3 The Just Shall Live By Faith

I.	Introduction: The author of Hebrews explains that true faith is the only thing that will commend us to God and then demonstrates it in the lives of Israel's greatest heroes.
II.	The Just Shall Live By Faith (Heb 11:1-3).
	A. The Nature of Faith (v. 1).
	1. The author of Hebrews declared that faith is the confidence in that which is unseen and the certainty of living one's life based upon belief in their convictions.
	B. The Witnesses of Faith (v. 2).
	1. The writer explained that those Old Testament saints who had lived for God in the past gained God's approval by acting upon their beliefs.
	C. The Content of Faith (v. 3).
	1. The writer called his audience to place their faith in God's creative power, knowing that it was by His word that the universe and everything in it came into being.
III.	Conclusion: The author encouraged his Jewish audience to place their faith in God's work of creation so that they would also accept God's work of redemption through faith.
