

## 1 Corinthians 14:1-12 The Edification of the Church Sunday, 6/09/19 – Pastor Stuart Fraser

- I. Introduction: Paul commanded the Corinthians to pursue love, above all else; but if they were to pursue any gift, they should desire to preach so that the church might be edified.
  - A. Paul told the Corinthians that tongues are useless in the church unless they can be rightly interpreted so that the rest of the church might be built up.

## II. The Edification of the Church (1 Cor 14:1-12).

- A. The Preeminence of Preaching (v. 1).
  - 1. Paul exalted love as the primary fruit of the Spirit that they should pursue, but if they were to desire a spiritual gift, they should pursue preaching.
- B. The Practice of Tongues (v. 2).
  - 1. Paul corrected the Corinthians about their defective understanding of tongues as a gift of ecstatic speech and denounced it because it didn't edify the church.
- C. The Preference of Preaching (vv. 3-5).
  - 1. Paul told the Corinthians that preaching was the preferred gift because it edified the church, encouraged the people, and comforted God's sheep.
- D. The Pointlessness of Tongues (vv. 6-12).
  - 1. Paul demonstrated the futility of speaking in unintelligible tongues by using the illustration of an instrument to show how tongues were not helpful.

III. Conclusion: Paul told the Corinthians they should pursue the gift of preaching instead of tongues because preaching edified the church and tongues only confused people.

## **Questions About: The Edification of the Church**

- 1. What is the primary purpose of the church? (**Eph 4:11-16**) Why does God want us to grow up? (**Rom 8:29**) What is Paul's main point in this chapter? (**1 Cor 14:26**)
- 2. What did Paul tell the Corinthians to pursue above everything else? (1 Cor 14:1) What had they been pursuing? (1 Cor 12:31) What gift did he say was the most important gift? (v. 1)
- 3. Why did Paul say speaking in tongues was only speaking to God (or "a god")? (v. 2) Why did tongues involve "mysteries"? How had Corinth been influenced by paganism?
- 4. Why did Paul say that preaching was superior to tongues? (1 Cor 14:3-5) What word did Paul repeat 4 times in these verses? (vv. 3-5) Why was edification so important to Paul?
- 5. Why did Paul say he wished they all spoke in tongues? (1 Cor 14:5) Did Paul speak in tongues? (v. 18) Why did he argue that preaching was superior to tongues?
- 6. How does Paul illustrate that language must be understood to be of any value? (1 Cor 14:6-9) Why did Paul say that tongues could not edify by themselves? (vv. 9, 27-28)
- 7. What did Paul say was the purpose of languages? (1 Cor 14:10-12) How would Paul have sounded like a barbarian if his speech wasn't understandable and clear? (vv. 11-12)
- 8. Why did Paul spend so much time discussing tongues? What was Paul's primary concern for the church? (1 Cor 14:26) Why did he want to limit the use of tongues? (I Cor 14:26-33)

## <u>Prayer</u>

- 1. Ask God to give you wisdom to understand this issue of speaking in tongues.
- 2. Ask God to show you how you can help edify the church by using your spiritual gifts.
