

John 18:28-38 The Rightful King of the Jews Sunday, 5/30/21 – Pastor Stuart Fraser

I.	Introduction: The Jews brought Jesus to Pilate and charged Him with being an
	insurrectionist, but Pilate interrogated Jesus and pronounced Him innocent of their charges.

- II. The Rightful King of the Jews (John 18:28-38).
 - A. The Jew's Hypocrisy (vv. 28-30).
 - 1. The Jewish leaders would not enter the house of Pilate so that they might not defile themselves for the Passover, yet they were willing to kill Jesus, their Messiah.
 - B. The Governor's Duplicity (vv. 31-32).
 - 1. Pilate gave the Jews permission to take Jesus and try Him, effectively attempting not to get involved in Jesus' case while maintaining a superficial sense of justice.
 - C. The Savior's Identity (vv. 33-34).
 - 1. Pilate privately interviewed Jesus and asked Him about the charges the Jews had brought against Him, but Jesus used this situation to reveal His true identity.
 - D. The King's Purity (vv. 35-38).
 - 1. Jesus told Pilate that He is a King, but that Rome did not need to worry about Him being a political rival because His kingdom was not of this world.
- III. Conclusion: The Jewish leaders tried to convince Pilate to crucify their King, but Jesus proved that He was innocent of insurrection, though He was Israel's King.

Questions About: The Rightful King of the Jews

- 1. What did the Jews charge Jesus with before Pilate? (Matt 27:11-14) What was the good confession that Jesus made before Pilate? (1 Tim 6:13) How was Jesus Israel's rightful King?
- 2. How did the Jews reveal their hypocrisy regarding Jesus? (John 18:28-30) Why were they worried that they would be defiled? (v. 28) What were they doing that was far worse?
- 3. Why did Pilate ask for an official accusation? (**John 18:29**) Why did the Jews not answer this question directly? (**John 18:30**) What were they hoping Pilate would do for them?
- 4. What did Pilate permit the Jews to do with Jesus? (**John 18:31-32**) What was their objection to Pilate's ruling? (**v. 31**) Why did Rome not permit Jews to execute criminals?
- 5. Why did Pilate ask Jesus if He was the King of the Jews? (**John 18:33-34**) Why did Jesus answer Pilate the way that He did? (**v. 34**) How was He trying to determine if Pilate believed the charges?
- 6. Why was Pilate particularly interested in Jesus' claim to be a King? (John 18:33-34) How was he responsible for keeping the peace in Judea? What did he know about the Jews? (Matt 27:18)
- 7. Why did Pilate ask Jesus about the real reason the Jews had arrested Him? (**John 18:35-38**) How did Jesus answer Pilate's question? (v. 36) What did this tell Pilate about Jesus' intentions?
- 8. What did Jesus say His mission was as Israel's King? (**John 18:37-38**) Why did Pilate declare Jesus innocent? (v. 38) Why did Pilate crucify Jesus later if He was innocent?

<u>Prayer</u>

- 1. Pray that God would help you to obey Him from the heart as well as in your actions.
- 2. Ask Jesus to help you proclaim the truth of the Gospel to those around you with boldness.
