- **III. Conclusion:** The author warned his readers about becoming spiritual pretenders who fall away from Jesus because they had rejected the full revelation of God.

Study Questions: The Tragedy of Rejecting God's Word

- 1. What are the different responses to God's word? (Matt 13:1-9; 18-23) Why were these Jews, in Hebrews, in danger of falling away from Jesus? (Heb 10:32-39)
- 2. What spiritual privileges did these Jews have? (**Heb 6:4-5**) Were these Jews saved? What does it mean that they were enlightened? (v. 4) How well were they taught? (**Heb 5:12**)
- 3. How had they tasted of the heavenly gift? (**Heb 6:4**) What was the heavenly gift? (**John 4:10**) How had they been partakers of the Holy Spirit? (**Heb 6:4**) Why does this not imply salvation?
- 4. How had they tasted God's Word? (**Heb 6:5**) What happens when Scripture is not believed? (**Matt 13:18-22**) How had they experienced the powers of the age to come? (**Heb 6:5**)
- 5. What does it mean to fall away? (**Heb 6:6-8**) Why is it impossible to renew them to repentance? (**v. 6**) Why is it impossible to lose one's salvation? (**John 10:27-29; Rom 8:35, 38-39**)
- 6. How do apostates crucify Jesus again? (**Heb 6:6-8**) What does it mean that they put Him to open shame? (**v. 6**) Why do those who reject Christ deserve severe punishment? (**Heb 10:29**)
- 7. What is the illustration that the author gave regarding salvation? (**Heb 6:7-8**) What does the rain represent? (**v. 7**) What are the two results of preaching God's truth? (**vv. 7-8**)
- 8. What does it mean that the ground will be burned? (**Heb 6:8**) How does this warning strike you? Who do you need to warn regarding salvation? Do you need to examine yourself?

- 1. Ask God to help you warn someone who might think they belong to Jesus but don't know Him.
- 2. Pray that Jesus might help you to have confidence that you are secure in your faith.
