

Genesis 3:1-7 The Fall of God's Image Bearers Sunday, 10/3/21 – Pastor Stuart Fraser

I. Introduction: Satan came to the garden to deceive God's image-bearers and influence them to question the Creator's words and character so that they would rebel against Him.

II. The Fall of God's Image-Bearers (Gen 3:1-7).

- A. The Plan of Satan (v. 1).
 - 1. Satan attempted to influence mankind to question God's goodness and persuade them to sin against Him so that he could take over the created order.
- B. The Production of Skepticism (vv. 2-3).
 - 1. Eve answered the snake by repeating God's command, but she revealed her heart was already starting to believe Satan's lie because she did not repeat it accurately.
- C. The Poison of the Serpent (vv. 4-5).
 - 1. Satan blatantly lied about God's command and indicated that God didn't want her or Adam to be free because He was afraid they would become His rivals.
- D. The Power of Seduction (v. 6).
 - 1. Eve saw that the fruit was beautiful, and for the first time, she was tempted to eat it because she believed what the serpent said rather than what God said.
- E. The Potency of Sin (v. 7).
 - 1. Adam and Eve ate the fruit, and their eyes were opened, but it only made them aware of evil, and they felt shame for their rebellion against God.
- III. Conclusion: God created human beings as His vice-regents over Eden, but they fell to the devil's temptation to rebel against God and plunged the human race into darkness.

Study Ouestions: The Fall of God's Image-Bearers

- 1. From where does evil come? (**Gen 3:1-7**) Why is Genesis 3 so critical? How does it explain all the problems we have in our culture? How does it explain pain? Suffering? Evil?
- 2. Who is Satan? What do you know about him? (Isa 14:12-15; Rev 12:1-12) What are some other names for Satan in the Bible? What are his primary character traits? (John 8:44)
- 3. Why did Satan approach Eve rather than Adam? (**Gen 3:1-7**) What was the first question in human history? (**v. 1**) What was Satan trying to get Eve to doubt? What was his strategy?
- 4. What was inaccurate about Eve's answer? (**Gen 3:2-3**) What did she omit from God's command? What did she add to it? How did she downplay God's punishment? (**v. 3**)
- 5. How did Satan blatantly lie to Eve? (**Gen 3:4-5**) Why did he say that God didn't want her to eat it? (**v. 5**) What did "good and evil" mean? (**v. 5**) How do humans want to define morality?
- 6. What was physically appealing about the fruit? (v. 6) Emotionally appealing? Intellectually appealing? How was Jesus tempted with the same three temptations? (Matt 4:1-11)
- 7. Where was Adam while Satan tempted Eve? (Gen 3:6) Why didn't Adam speak up and rebuke Satan? Do you sit by passively as Adam did? Do you listen to Satan as Eve did?
- 8. Why did they immediately make clothes out of fig leaves? (**Gen 3:7**) Why does sin cause shame? What are the ways people try to cover their sins? Why do we do this?

Praver

- 1. Pray and ask God to reveal to you how you are like Adam, or you are like Eve.
- 2. Confess any sins that you may have tried to cover with acts of self-righteousness.
