- 1. How has God changed you through studying His word? What are some parallels you see of Corinth and our culture? What about the Corinthians and you? What do you need to learn?
- 2. Why were there divisions in this church? (1 Cor 1:1-4:21) How do people follow leaders today? What was Paul's solution? (1 Cor 3:5-9) What did Paul preach? (1 Cor 1:23; 2:2)
- 3. What sins were affecting this church? (1 Cor 5:1-6:20) How are Christians supposed to deal with unrepentant sinners? (5:5-7, 11-13) How do we deal with repentant sinners? (Eph 6:1-2)
- 4. What questions did the Corinthians have about marital relationships? (1 Cor 7:1-40) What advice did Paul give to those who were married and single? (7:17, 20) Why? (7:31-35)
- 5. What question did the Corinthians have about meat sacrificed to idols? (1 Cor 8:1-10:31) How did Paul say we should treat our liberties? (10:31) What do we need to be careful about? (10:23)
- 6. How did Paul deal with disorder in Corinth? (1 Cor 11:1-14:40) How did they misuse their spiritual gifts? What was Paul's solution to their dysfunction? (13:1-7; 14:26, 40)
- 7. What doctrine did the Corinthians deny? (1 Cor 15:1-16:24) Why is it important that Jesus rose from the grave? (15:12:20) How does the resurrection motivate us to serve? (15:50-58)
- 8. What were Paul's final commands to the Corinthians? (1 Cor 16:13-14) Are you on the alert? Are you standing firm in the faith? What does it mean to "act like men"? (v. 13)

- 1. Pray that God would help you to see what lessons you need to learn from the Corinthians.
- 2. Ask God to give you the strength to stand firm and to be more courageous in your faith.
