## Joshua 22:1-34

## **Problems With Borderline Believers**

- **I. Introduction:** The Israelites observed the tribes living outside Canaan building an altar, and quickly concluded their brothers had turned away from God to worship idols.
- **II.** Problems With Borderline Believers (**Josh 22:1-34**).
  - A. Their Commendation (vv. 1-9).
    - 1. Joshua praised the tribes living outside Canaan for fulfilling their obligation to fight alongside their brothers and released them from God's service.
  - B. Their Compromise (vv. 10-20).
    - 1. The Israelites saw the tribes living outside Canaan building an altar which concerned them because it could have indicated their infidelity towards God.
  - C. Their Commitment (vv. 21-29).
    - 1. The tribes living outside the Promised Land explained that the altar was a witness to their children that they were dedicated to following the Lord.
  - D. Their Contentment (vv. 30-34).
    - 1. Everyone seemed pleased with the solution because both sides were concerned about remaining loyal to God, and civil war had been narrowly avoided.
- **III.** Conclusion: The tribes living in Canaan confronted their brothers when they perceived they were straying from God, but the Eastern tribes affirmed their devotion to God.

## **Study Questions: Problems With Borderline Believers**

- 1. How should you react when you see a Christian engaging in compromise? How are we to deal graciously with those involved in perceived sin? What can we learn from Israel?
- 2. How did Joshua commend Gad, Reuben, and Manasseh? (Josh 22:1-9) Where did these tribes request their tribal allotment? (Num 32) Why did they want this land? (Num 32:1-5)
- 3. How did Joshua encourage them to follow God? (**Josh 22:5**) How long had these tribes been fighting in Canaan? What was the danger of being isolated from the other tribes?
- 4. What did these Eastern tribes do that concerned the Western tribes? (Josh 22:10-20) Why were they prepared to go to war with them? (vv. 12, 16) Why were they afraid? (v. 18)
- 5. Why did the tribes choose Phinehas? (Num 25:6-18; Josh 22:17, 31) What did they suggest that these 2 ½ tribes do if they were unhappy? (Josh 22:19-20) Was their concern warranted?
- 6. How did the Eastern tribes react to the other Israelites? (Josh 22:21-29) Why did they say they had built this altar for their children? (v. 24) How was it to be a witness? (vv. 26-29)
- 7. How did the Western tribes react to the Eastern tribes' explanation? (**Josh 22:30-34**) Was God pleased? Did this decision unite Israel? Why did it divide the tribes?
- 8. Why is it necessary to confront compromise? How did the Eastern tribe's decision to settle outside Canaan affect their future? (Josh 2:6-10) What are you settling for in your own life?

- 1. Pray God will keep you focused on following Him fully so that you will inherit His promises.
- 2. Ask God to help you resist the temptation to compromise and settle for the world's treasures.
