


I. Introduction: Your life has an intended purpose. Genesis 1:26-28; Matthew 28:18-20; Mathew 27:37-40

 - B. Grow In Obedience To God's Commands [Obeying].
- 3. Multiply The Image of Christ.
 - A. Share The Gospel With Others [Preaching].
 - B. Teach And Train Other Younger Christians To Make Disciples [Teaching].
