

## **1 Corinthians 13:4-7** The Description of Love

<b>I.</b>	Introduction: Paul encouraged the Corinthians to love God's people with sacrificial love,
	and then he described what God's love looked like in the life of a believer.

A.	The Apostle told the believers in Corinth that God's love is active. Paul described love
	using fifteen different verbs. Love is not a feeling; it is defined by what it does.

## II. The Description of Love (1 Cor 13:4-7).

- A. Love Is Patient ["Suffers long; long tempered"] (v. 4).
- B. Love Is Kind ["Actively generous; useful; serving; gracious"] (v. 4).
- C. Love Is Not Jealous ["Does not envy"] (v. 4).
- D. Love Does Not Brag ["Parade itself"] (v. 4).
- E. Love Is Not Arrogant ["Puffed up"] (v. 5).
- F. Love Does Not Act Unbecomingly ["Behave rudely"] (v. 5).
- G. Love Does Not Seek Its Own ["Isn't self-seeking"] (v. 5).
- Conclusion: Paul elevated love as the greatest virtue that the Corinthians could possess and III. described it as active service in the body of Christ.

## **Questions About: The Description of Love**

- 1. How would you describe love? How does the world define love? How is that different than God's definition? (1 Cor 13:4-7) Why does God describe love as a verb?
- 2. What does it mean that love is patient? (1 Cor 13:4) How do we show patience with people in the church? How does God model patience? What opportunities do you have to be patient?
- 3. What does it mean to be "kind" to others? (1 Cor 13:4) What principles did Jesus teach about kindness? (Matt 5:40-42) What is evil about indifference? (1 John 3:17)
- 4. Have you ever found yourself envious of what another believer had? (1 Cor 13:4) According to James, why do Christians fight? (James 4:1-4) What's the solution? (James 4:6-7)
- 5. What does it mean that love "does not brag"? (1 Cor 13:4) What complaint did John's disciples have? (John 3:25-31) What did John do rather than exalt himself? (John 3:30)
- 6. What is the difference between "bragging" and "arrogance"? (1 Cor 13:4) Why is arrogance a problem for Christians? (Prov 3:5-7; Rom 12:3) What is the opposite of arrogance?
- 7. What does it mean to not "act unbecomingly"? (1 Cor 13:4) Have you ever had someone act rudely toward you in church? How should you respond to rudeness? (Eph 4:29)
- 8. How does love, "not seek its own"? (1 Cor 13:5) How did Jesus display this kind of love? How do you seek the good of others first? What ways do you need to change?

## **Prayer**

- 1. Ask God to show you how you should love the church the way He wants you to love it.
- 2. Ask God to give you the power to change, so that you love the church the way He does.
