



TO TURN A BLIND EYE

Most English speakers are accustomed to the numerous quirky sayings and phrases in the English language, but those for whom English is not their first language will know that it's sometimes difficult to understand why one "gets on a soapbox" when they force their opinions onto someone, or why someone who unexpectedly managed to avoid danger was "saved by the bell".

The truth is that many of these phrases and idioms have a fascinating history behind them, which can definitely shed light to their seemingly strange choice of words in these phrases.

To turn a blind eye means, pretend not to notice.

This phrase takes us back to the distant year of 1801, when the legendary British naval officer Horatio Nelson defeated the Danish-Norwegian fleet by refusing to comply with his superior officer.

The story goes as follows: at the Battle of Copenhagen, Nelson's ships fought against a much larger fleet, and his superior made a sign to retreat. In response, Nelson, who was blinded in one eye early in his career, brought up his telescope to his bad eye and said that he didn't see any signal, refusing to surrender and subsequently emerging victorious from the battle.

It is disputed by historians whether this bold event actually took place, but the phrase definitely stuck and became widely used.

Greetings to our supporting churches and families, and the many individuals praying for us!

The Lord has blessed in many wonderful ways during the past six months. We've been able to visit several new churches and met many new friends during our ministry and deputation travels. We're praising the Lord for protecting us along the way, and for seeing our support level reaching the 55% level!

In addition to our deputation efforts, in February we traveled to Japan for Ronn to be the speaker for two different Couples Conferences (Freedom Baptist Church near NAS Atsugi, and Maranatha Baptist Church, Okinawa). Between conferences, Ronn also had the opportunity to preach at Yokosuka Baptist Church (where we provided a Couples Conference in 2024).



So far in 2025, the Lord has blessed us with opportunities to present our ministry in churches in North and South Carolina, Connecticut, Virginia, West Virginia, Missouri, and Arkansas. Ronn preached in many of the churches, taught in chapel services, bus ministries, and in an array of Sunday Schools. In all the places we've gone, we've especially come to value the many people that have taken our prayer cards and shared that they would be praying for us. The prayer support is so encouraging to us!

In early June we completed the second year of Missionary Candidate School at the BIMI Headquarters in Harrison, Tennessee. In addition to meeting with our Director (Bryan Baggett), the training sessions helped us tune our approach to supporting the needs of the pastors and churches that are serving our U.S. Military overseas (and in the United States). The Candidate School also gave us opportunities to visit with fellow missionaries that we met last year, and we made new friends from the new first-year candidates.
