

Growing in one's faith is also like a game of connecting the dots. That's because it involves a process of discovering the

relationship between the things Christians are supposed to do and the meaning behind those things. The Lord's Supper for example, on its own, it is like a floating dot. Unleavened bread and the cup are but bread and wine, waiting to be connected to something. So, Jesus on the night He was betrayed He connected the Paschal meal to His death. This connection made their meaning clear.


Of course, in the game of connecting the dots, there is always the Christian life, we must avoid connecting God's dots to the wrong things. For example, some have mistakenly connected the baptism dot to their salvation when what it should be connected to is the Great Commission. When we make the right connection, we understand that it's supposed to be a witness to a watching world, performed by those who have right thing, God's intentions become evident.


