1. The Fertile Soil of our Heart; the Soul.

Love (Devine Agape) is the highest form of Christian love, it is a sacrificial, and unconditional love. Unlike emotional or romantic love, it is a deliberate choice to seek the well-being of others regardless of their merit or response.

Core characteristics

- . **Unconditional:** It does not depend on the recipient's actions or worthiness.
- . **Self-Sacrificing:** It prioritizes the needs of others above one's own, modeled after the character of God.
- . **Volitional:** it is a product of the will and commitment rather than fleeting feelings.

A Biblical example of this sacrificial love is Jochebed. The Mother of Moses.

Peace: Mary Mother of Jesus (Luke 2:19 NKJV)
