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BIG IDEA:

A fulfilling life isn't about possessions; it's about prioritizing relationships, purpose, and serving others with an eternal perspective.

LUKE 12:32-34 (CSB)

'Don't be afraid, little flock, because your Father delights to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Make money-bags for yourselves that won't grow old, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven,

where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.'



**BEFORE JESUS REFORMS OUR HABITS,
HE RE-ROOTS OUR HEARTS.**

1. Re-root the anxious soul in divine love

LUKE 12:32 (CSB)

“Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father delights to give you the kingdom.”

**Our culture has taught us to believe that enough is
always just one purchase, one promotion, one post
away...but never here.**

Pray:

**“Father, You delight to give me the Kingdom. I have
enough in You.”**

Simplicity is an invitation to trust more.

2. Re-train the disordered heart toward eternal treasure

LUKE 12:34 (CSB)

“For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”

**Whatever captures your attention will eventually
capture your affection.**

**What you treasure reveals what you trust, and what you
trust will shape who you become.**

ASK YOURSELF:

- **“What am I letting shape what I love?”**
- **“Am I being disciplined by the algorithm, or by the Kingdom?”**

**3. Re-form the disciple into a person of simplicity, trust
and generosity**

LUKE 12:33 (CSB)

“Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Make moneybags for yourselves that do not wear out, with treasure in heaven that will not fail.”

PROVERBS 19:17 (CSB)

**“Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the Lord, and
He will repay him for his deed.”**

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
