Romans 10:1-13

- ¹ Brothers and sisters, my heart's desire and prayer to God for the Israelites is that they may be saved. ² For I can testify about them that they are zealous for God, but their zeal is not based on knowledge. ³ Since they did not know the righteousness of God and sought to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness. ⁴ Christ is the culmination of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.
- ⁵ Moses writes this about the righteousness that is by the law: "The person who does these things will live by them." ⁶ But the righteousness that is by faith says: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) ⁷ "or 'Who will descend into the deep?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). ⁸ But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the message concerning faith that we proclaim: ⁹ If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved.
- ¹¹ As Scripture says, "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame." ¹² For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, ¹³ for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Read verses 1-4

- 1. What does Paul's heart and prayer for Israel reveal about his priorities and love for his people?
- 2. Why does Paul say their zeal is not based on knowledge? Think about your own understanding of your relationship with God; does it lean more toward zeal or toward knowledge?
- 3. What does it mean that Christ is the culmination of the law?

Read verses 5-10

- 4. What is the contrast Paul draws between righteousness by the law and righteousness by faith?
- 5. How do verses 6–8 challenge the idea that we must do something extraordinary to reach God?
- 6. What is the significance of confessing with the mouth and believing in the heart? (Bonus task for overachievers: Memorize Romans 10:9-10).

Read verses 11-13

- 7. What does it mean that 'everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved'?
- 8. How does this passage emphasize the inclusiveness of the gospel message?
- 9. How might these verses impact the way we view evangelism or outreach?
