## **Romans 9:1-5**

<sup>1</sup> I speak the truth in Christ—I am not lying, my conscience confirms it through the Holy Spirit— <sup>2</sup> I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. <sup>3</sup> For I could wish that I myself were cursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my people, those of my own race, <sup>4</sup> the people of Israel. Theirs is the adoption to sonship; theirs the divine glory, the covenants, the receiving of the law, the temple worship and the promises. <sup>5</sup> Theirs are the patriarchs, and from them is traced the human ancestry of the Messiah, who is God over all, forever praised! Amen.

## Read verses 1-5

- 1. What emotions does Paul express in these verses? Why do you think he feels so strongly?
- 2. How does Paul describe his connection to his people, the Israelites? How had Paul been treated by 'his people' after his conversion? (See Acts 9:17-30)
- 3. What privileges and blessings does Paul list that belong to Israel? Briefly explore the value of those blessings to followers of Christ today.
- 4. Of the blessings you just explored, which one(s) do you find particularly meaningful for yourself? Why?
- 5. What do these verses reveal about Paul's view of God's promises and the Messiah's identity?
- 6. How does this passage shape your understanding of compassion, identity, or calling?
