Romans 8:18-27

¹⁸ I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. ¹⁹ For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed. ²⁰ For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God.

²² We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. ²³ Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴ For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently.

²⁶ In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. ²⁷ And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God.

- 2. What does creation's eager expectation for the children of God suggest about God's ultimate plan?
- 3. How is the image of creation being subjected to frustration both sobering and hopeful?

Read verses 22-25

- 4. Why do you think Paul uses the metaphor of childbirth to describe creation's groaning?
- 5. What does it mean to wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship and the redemption of our bodies?
- 6. How does Paul's teaching on hope challenge or encourage your current outlook on life?

Read verses 26-27

- 7. In what ways does the Spirit help us in our weakness, according to Paul?
- 8. How does the image of the Spirit interceding with wordless groans deepen your understanding of prayer?
- 9. What does it mean that the Spirit intercedes 'in accordance with the will of God'?
