Covenant Partnership Class


March 2, 9am-3pm

THE GREATER WORK OF CHRIST

Isaiah 66 Thus says the Lord:

- "Heaven is my throne, and the earth is my footstool; what is the house that you would build for me, and what is the place of my rest?
- ² All these things my hand has made, and so all these things came to be, declares the Lord. But this is the one to whom I will look: he who is humble and contrite in spirit and trembles at my word.
- ³ "He who slaughters an ox is like one who kills a man; he who sacrifices a lamb, like one who breaks a dog's neck;

- he who presents a grain offering, like one who offers pig's blood;
- he who makes a memorial offering of frankincense, like one who blesses an idol.
- These have chosen their own ways, and their soul delights in their abominations;
- ⁴ I also will choose harsh treatment for them and bring their fears upon them, because when I called, no one answered, when I spoke, they did not listen; but they did what was evil in my eyes and chose that in which I did not delight."

⁵ Hear the word of the Lord, you who tremble at his word: "Your brothers who hate you and cast you out for my name's sake have said, 'Let the Lord be glorified, that we may see your joy'; but it is they who shall be put to shame. ⁶ "The sound of an uproar from the city! A sound from the temple! The sound of the Lord, rendering recompense to his enemies!

The Time of Reformation

The comparing and contrasting of the verb tenses throughout this passage are critical for understanding its historical significance. 9 Now even the first covenant had regulations for worship and an earthly place of holiness.

The Lord established the old covenant specific to the time, prescribed under the Mosaic Law, and with the intention of being obsolete in Christ.

Every aspect of the old covenant and the Mosaic Law must be understood in light of the person and work of Jesus, The Christ.

Colossians 2:16 Therefore let no one pass judgment on you in questions of food and drink, or with regard to a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath. 17 These are a shadow of the things to come, but the substance belongs to Christ.

We cannot, accurately or in detail, speak about that which we can neither see nor fully comprehend.


1 Corinthians 15:35 But someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" ³⁶ You foolish person! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. ³⁷ And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain. ³⁸ But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body. 39 For not all flesh is the same, but there is one kind for humans, another for animals, another for birds, and another for fish. 40 There are heavenly bodies and earthly bodies, but the glory of the heavenly is of one kind, and the glory of the earthly is of another...

... 45 Thus it is written, "The first man Adam became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. ⁴⁶ But it is not the spiritual that is first but the natural, and then the spiritual. ⁴⁷ The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. 48 As was the man of dust, so also are those who are of the dust, and as is the man of heaven, so also are those who are of heaven. ⁴⁹ Just as **we have borne** the image of the man of dust, we shall also bear the image of the man of heaven.

Isaiah 65:²⁰ No more shall there be in it an infant who lives but a few days, or an old man who does not fill out his days, for the young man shall die a hundred years old, and the sinner a hundred years old shall be accursed.

Revelation 6:9 When he opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain for the word of God and for the witness they had borne. ¹⁰ They cried out with a loud voice, "O Sovereign Lord, holy and true, how long before you will judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell on the earth?" 11 Then they were each given a white robe and told to rest a little longer, until the number of their fellow servants and their brothers should be complete, who were to be killed as they themselves had been.





²⁰ Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, ²¹ equip you with everything good that you may do his will, working in us that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.
