

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# The church is not an OLD TESTAMENT Institution but a NEW TESTAMENT Institution




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## The church was founded by JESUS CHRIST during His earthly ministry

The church was NOT founded on the DAY OF PENTECOST by the Holy Spirit



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The Day of Pentecost was not the FORMATION of the church, but the CONFIRMATION of the Church Jesus established

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#### The Nature of the New Testament church is

## LOCAL & VISIBLE, not UNIVERSAL & INVISIBLE

"The ecclesia is a local church. This is what Christ meant when He used the word. Would the apostles have been able to understand any other meaning? What other kind can minister the Word to lost persons as well as minister to the physical needs of poor people and those who are ill? What other kind can preach the Gospel?"

"Why all the debate about the distinction between the universal and local church? Why spend so much time on the etymology of "ekklesia" and its uses in the New Testament? The reason is simple. Misunderstanding the New Testament concept of the church diminishes the importance of the local church to the individual believer.





When the local church is trumped by the universal church, personal accountability is minimized, Christian growth is stunted, and practically, the local church vanishes. People move from church to church to 'bless' each congregation with their 'gifts' and insights only to become spiritual pygmies. The work of God in this world is done primarily through the local congregations. That is God's plan."



B. H. Carroll (1843-1914) Founding President of SWBTS



"The whole of the modern Baptist idea of a now existent funiversal, invisible church' was borrowed from Pedo-baptist (those who advocate or practice infant sprinkling, jdl) CONTESSIONS Of faith in the Reformation times, and the Pedo-baptists devised it to offset the equally erroneous idea of the Romanist 'universal visible church'. We need to be well indoctrinated on this point, because the error is not harmless. It is used to depreciate Christ's earth-church, the pillar and ground of the truth."



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#### 1833 New Hampshire Confession of Faith Mouniversal church

1925 Baptist Faith and Message

No universal church



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1963 Southern Baptist Confession of Faith

Added..."the church is the body of Christ which includes all the redeemed of all the ages."

2000 Baptist Faith and Message

Declared..."The New Testament speaks also of the Church as the Body of Christ which includes all the Redeemed of all the ages, believers from every tribe, and tongue, and people, and nations."



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Advantages of the "Local ecclesia (assembly) Only" position...

1. It advances the clear meaning of the word "ecclesia."



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2. It reinforces the compelling need for church membership.

3. It exposes the dangers of interdentionalism & ecumenicalism.



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4. It underscores the church's complete autonomy & dependence on Christ.

5. It places the need to maintain doctrinal purity on each congregation.



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
## The Root & Fruit of the New Testament church is HISTORICAL

Speaking of death..."All earthly things go down through these dread gates, but Christ's church, for which he gave himself, will never cease to exist; there will always be Christians in the world. This was a bold prediction for a homeless teacher, with a handful of followers."



S.H. Ford (1819-1905) Baptist Historian



"Succession among Baptists is not a linked chain of churches or ministers, uninterrupted and traceable at this distant day... The true and defensible doctrine is that baptized believers have existed in every age since John baptized in Jordan, and have met as a baptized congregation in covenant and fellowship where an opportunity permitted."



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

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"Without boast or pride but with joy and certainty, Baptists trace their lineage back to an ancient and honorable beginning - to the meeting of John the forerunner and Jesus in the holy baptizing scene in the Jordan River. Through the centuries, sometimes by indistinct lines, sometimes by definite groups and mighty doctrines, they profess love for and loyalty to teachings and principles which Christ gave to the apostolic group and are recorded in the New Testament," 1939 SBC Presidential Address

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


#### Modern View – Baptists began in 1644 when the name "Baptist" appeared

In a 1893 article in Johnson's Universal Encyclopedia Whitsett argued that the practice of immersion began in seventeenth century England.

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He taught that up to 1641 all Baptists employed sprinkling and pouring as the mode of baptism and that no case of immersion took place among American Baptists before the year 1644.
