DOCTRINE OF THE CHURCH // CHAPTER ONE

I. INTRODUCTION

Throughout history, there has been significant debate as to the definition and importance of the local church. Some have tried to downplay the importance of the church and others have sought to redefine the role and function of the church with new models and methodologies. Without a proper biblical foundation for the church, we can easily be swayed by the winds of doctrine (Ephesians 4:14) and what is current in our culture.

The church is more than a sociological phenomenon, it is a divinely established institution! From the very beginning, God dreamt of the church being His divine instrument to fulfill his eternal plan and purpose on planet earth. Understanding what God says about the church should be the single most important shaping ingredient to 'why' we exist, 'what' we believe about church and consequently 'how' we do church.



V. THE IMPORTANCE OF PATTERN
