The King Who Refuses to Be Used Discussion Questions

1.	The crowd shouted "Hosanna!" expecting Jesus to deliver them from Rome. What are some "Romes" in your own life — things you wish Jesus would remove — and how does this message challenge you?
2.	How do we sometimes use Jesus to bless our own agendas — political, personal, or otherwise? What does it look like to resist that temptation?
3.	John tells us many people came because of the sign of Lazarus being raised. Why do you think signs and miracles don't always lead to lasting faith?
4.	Jesus chose to ride a donkey instead of a warhorse. What does this teach us about the kind of King He is, and how does that shape the way we follow Him today?
5.	The sermon ends with the question: "Will I bow my life before Him as King?" What area of your life might God be inviting you to surrender more fully right now?
	These questions should spark deeper reflection and meaningful conversation about the key points of the sermon
