

## ***When the Problem Stays*** **Discussion Questions**

1. The early church didn't begin by asking God to change their circumstances—they began by remembering who God is. What do your prayers usually begin with? What might change if worship came before your requests?
  
2. The sermon said, "*The size of your God determines the steadiness of your life.*" Where have you seen your view of God either strengthen or weaken your response to difficult circumstances?
  
3. The believers asked for boldness, not relief. Is there an area of your life where you've been asking God to remove a situation when you may also need to ask Him for courage to remain faithful in it?
  
4. Acts 4 shows that boldness was expressed both through speaking about Jesus and through radical generosity toward one another. Which of those two expressions feels more challenging for you right now, and why?
  
5. What's one "threat" or unresolved situation you're carrying today? As a group, pray not only that God would work in that situation, but also that He would give each person the courage, faithfulness, and steadiness to follow Christ regardless of the outcome.

*These questions should spark deeper reflection and meaningful conversation about the key points of the sermon.*
