

The Second Act Has Begun **Discussion Questions**

1. The sermon frames Acts as the “second act” of Jesus’ work. Where in your life are you tempted to live like the story has already ended instead of continuing?

2. The disciples had to be redirected away from both control (“taking over”) and disengagement (“checking out”). Which of those two tendencies do you see more in yourself right now—and why?

3. Jesus tells the disciples to wait for the Holy Spirit before stepping into the mission. What does it look like for you to rely on the Spirit instead of just acting on your own strength or urgency?

4. The sermon defines a witness not just as someone who talks about Jesus, but someone whose life points to Him. Where in your everyday life (work, home, relationships) do you have opportunities to live that out?

5. You are not responsible for outcomes—the Spirit handles conviction and transformation. How might that truth change the way you approach conversations, relationships, or moments where faith feels risky?

These questions should spark deeper reflection and meaningful conversation about the key points of the sermon.
