

## ***Who Gets Your Yes?***

### **Discussion Questions**

1. “Cost reveals hierarchy.” What do you think that means? Can you think of a time when a difficult choice revealed what mattered most to you?
2. Peter says, “We must obey God rather than men.” Where do you feel the greatest pressure from other people—their approval, expectations, opinions, or influence—to soften or compromise your obedience to Jesus?
3. The message contrasts the Peter who denied Jesus before a servant girl with the Peter who later stood before the council. What had changed? How does knowing that Peter's courage was rooted in the risen Jesus and the Holy Spirit change the way you think about courage and obedience?
4. Sometimes the person competing with God for our obedience isn't someone else—it's us. Where are your own desires for comfort, control, security, approval, money, relationships, or something else making obedience difficult right now?
5. The sermon asks, “If Jesus has already defeated the things I'm trying so desperately to protect myself from, why am I giving them my obedience?” What are you currently trying to protect through compromise? What would it look like to trust Jesus with the cost of obeying him?

*These questions should spark deeper reflection and meaningful conversation about the key points of the sermon.*
