Evidence for Assurance Consistency toward Christlikeness

How do we know whether or not we are truly Christians?

Confidence and assurance are important human attributes.

To lack either opens the door to trouble in life.

The same is true in the Christian life.

Trying to live the Christian life while lacking assurance that you are truly a Christian is like driving a car with the brakes on.

A common question Christians ask is, "Can I know that I really know God?"

"Can I know that I am saved?"

Some people will tell you that you can never know. Many religious groups would tell you there is no way to know for sure whether you are going to Heaven or Hell (assuming they believe in Heaven or Hell).

You just have to die and find out!

Since Heaven or Hell awaits us all, not to know where you will spend eternity is the worst form of ignorance and negligence!

Your eternal destiny is not something about which you can afford to be ambivalent!

There can be no more paramount issue in your life than the issue of whether or not your sins are forgiven and you are in a right relationship with God.

If you don't know, you are in a precarious position.

The religion of "I don't know" is the devil's religion. When you come to die, you will regret not making sure of this crucial matter earlier.

So, we must examine ourselves... we must take a test!

What are the tell-tale marks of a genuine Believer?

2 Corinthians 13:5 (ESV)

Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless indeed you fail to meet the test!

Most people abhor taking tests...

And as we are in the summer why would I preach a series about "testing yourself"?


This series is actually about testing yourself on whether or not you are going to Heaven or Hell...

Three times "KEEP" is used...

1. Present Active Subjunctive...

- 2. Present Active Participle...
- 3. Present Active Subjunctive...

In these verses John tells us not only WHAT consistency toward Christlikeness looks like, but HOW to develop this consistency in our own lives...

1 John 2:3–4 (ESV) — And by this we know that we have come to know him, if we keep his commandments. Whoever says "I know him" but does not keep his commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in him

THREE times "KEEP" is used...

This passage contains TWO of the times...

1. Present Active Subjunctive...

2. Present Active Participle...

1 John 2:4–5a (ESV) — Whoever says "I know him" but does not keep his commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in him, but whoever keeps his word, in him truly the love of God is perfected.

What is motivating you to live in Christlike Consistency?

> <u>REQUIREMENT</u> – I <u>HAVE</u> to do it...

> <u>**RESPONSIBILITY</u> – I <u>NEED</u> to do it...</u>**

> <u>**RELATIONSHIP**</u> – I <u>WANT</u> to do it...

John 14:15 (ESV) — If you love me, you will keep my commandments.

John 14:21 (ESV) — Whoever has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me. And he who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him."

Matthew 22:37–40 (ESV) — And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets."

1 John 2:5b–6 (ESV) — ... By this we may know that we are in him: whoever says he abides in him ought to walk in the same way in which he walked.

The "him" and "he" in this passage is referring to Jesus...

Let's read it again, but replacing the pronouns with "Jesus"...

1 John 2:5b–6 (ESV) — ... By this we may know that we are in <u>Jesus</u>: whoever says he abides in <u>Jesus</u> ought to walk in the same way in which <u>Jesus</u> walked.

To abide in Jesus means to rely upon His power as our source of strength...

John 15:5 (ESV) — I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.

1 Corinthians 4:20 (ESV) — For the kingdom of God does not consist in talk but in power.

John 15:10 (ESV) — If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love.
