

FOUR NECESSITIES FOR THE FILLING OF THE SPIRIT

#1 Desire for the Spirit

Scriptural Support:

Luke 11:13 NIV

If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!

Commentary:

A genuine desire for the Holy Spirit is crucial for being filled. Jesus encourages believers to ask for the Holy Spirit, indicating that God is eager to give this gift to those who seek it. This desire should be accompanied by faith and an acknowledgment of one's need for the Spirit's empowerment in daily life.

#2 Obedience to God

Scriptural Support:

Acts 5:32 NIV

We are witnesses of these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him.

Commentary:

Obedience is a key component of receiving the Holy Spirit. This verse highlights that the Holy Spirit is given to those who follow God's commands. Living in obedience opens the heart to the work of the Spirit, allowing for a

deeper relationship and greater fullness of His presence in our lives.

#3 Faith in Jesus Christ

Scriptural Support:

John 7:38-39 NIV

Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them. By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive.

Commentary:

Faith in Jesus is foundational for receiving the Holy Spirit. This passage illustrates that those who believe in Christ will have the Spirit flow within them like living water. It emphasizes that the Spirit is a gift for believers, reinforcing the importance of a personal relationship with Jesus as a pathway to being filled with the Holy Spirit.

#4 Willingness to Surrender

Scriptural Support:

Ephesians 5:18 NIV

Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit.

Commentary:

Surrendering to the Holy Spirit is an active choice that requires letting go of control and allowing the Spirit to lead. Paul contrasts being filled with the Spirit to being drunk, suggesting that just as one loses control when intoxicated, believers should willingly lose control to the Spirit's guidance. This surrender is essential for experiencing the fullness of the Spirit and living a life that reflects God's will.

Conclusion

These four necessities—desire, obedience, faith, and willingness to

surrender—are interrelated and foundational for being filled with the Holy Spirit. Each point emphasizes a different aspect of our relationship with God and the transformative work of the Holy Spirit in our lives.
