


## Matthew 27:3-10



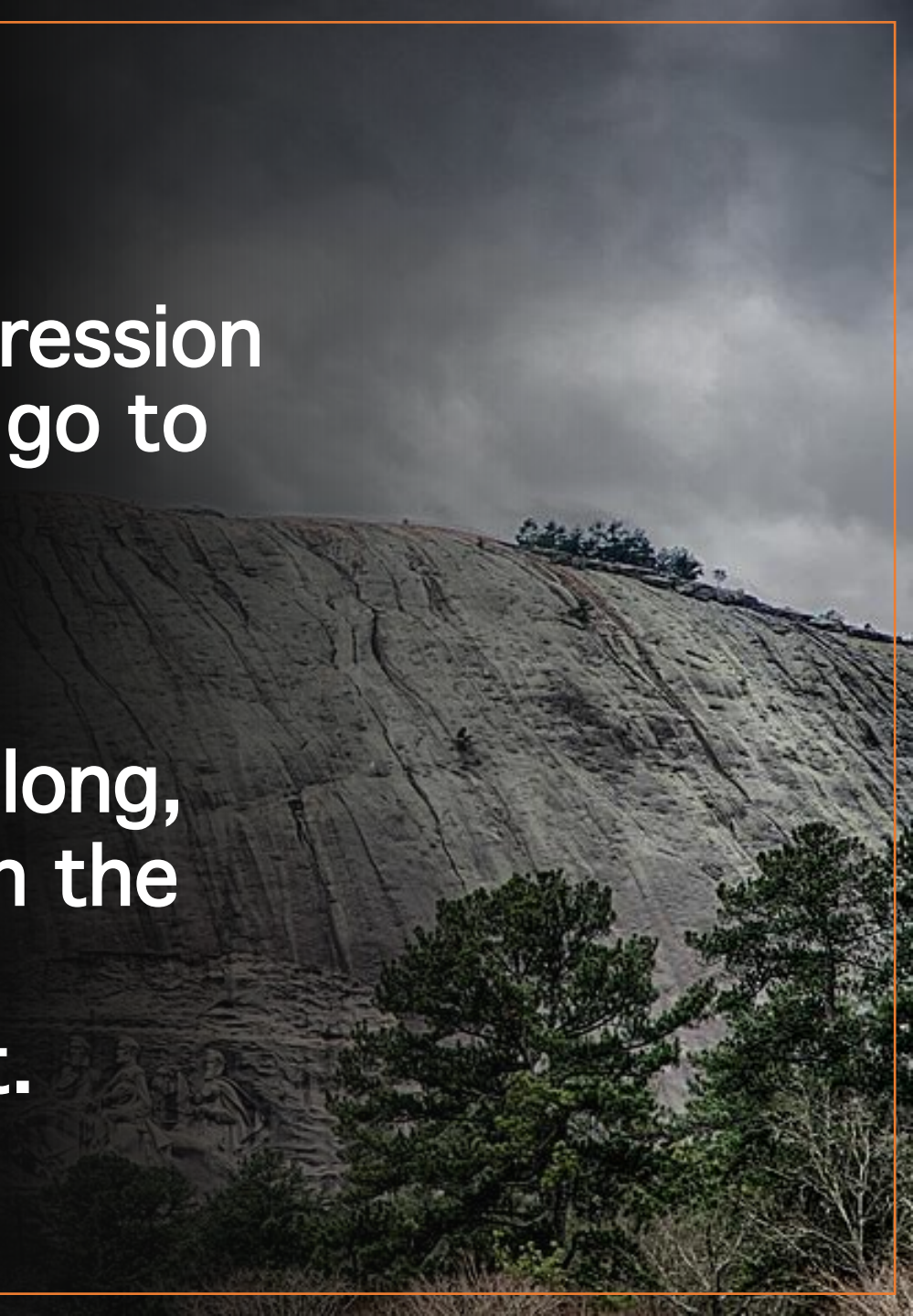

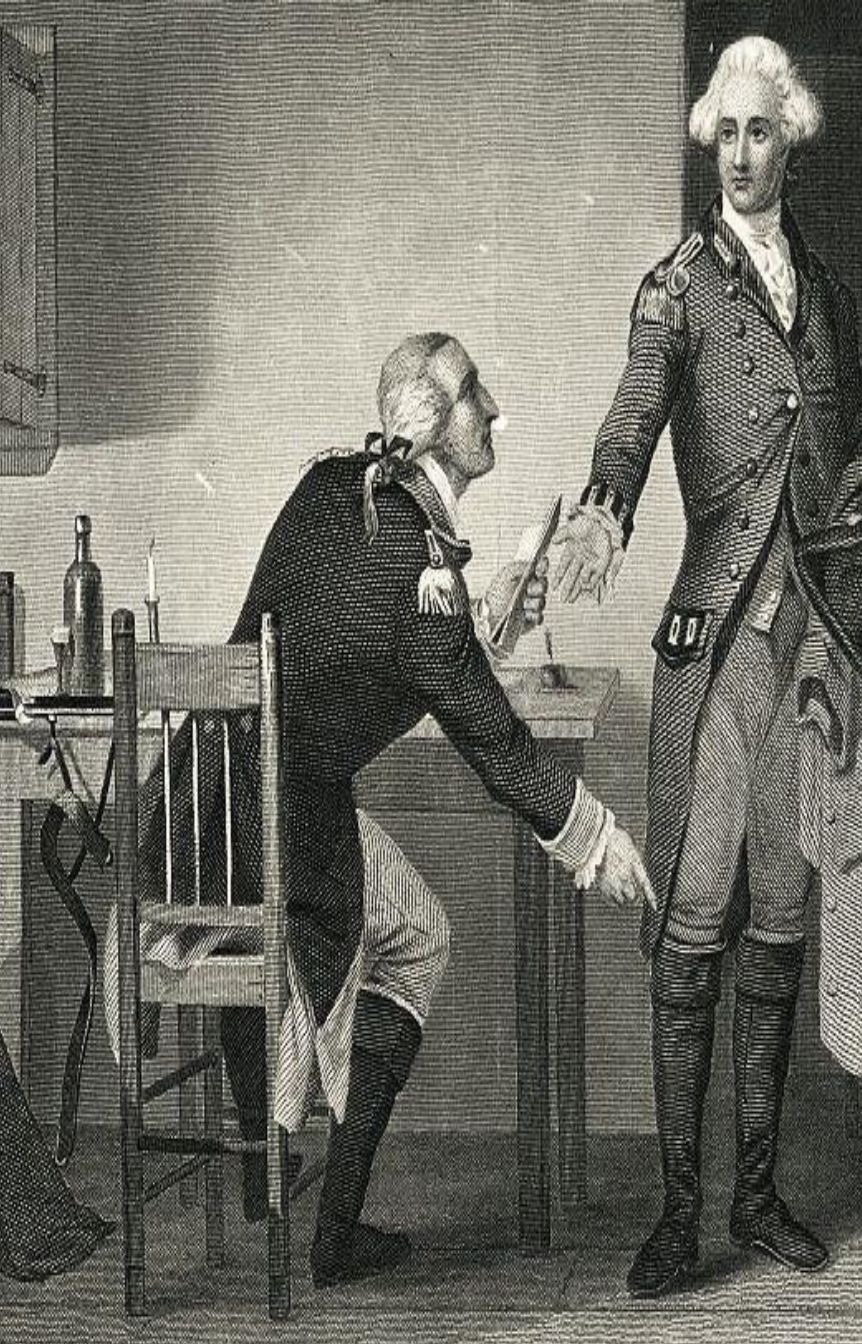
