

Confusion: The Devil's Open Door

***“For God is not the author of confusion, but of peace”
(1 Corinthians 14:33).***

Introduction - Over the past few weeks, my phone has rung again and again with desperate calls from pastors and leaders across this nation. Ministries that are miles apart geographically—different in style and culture—are all facing the same sinister assault. It is as though the enemy has unleashed a coordinated strategy against the Body of Christ, and the weapon he is wielding is **confusion**.

I do not preach these words lightly. This may be one of the most urgent and necessary messages I have ever delivered—especially in the spiritual climate we now find ourselves in. The attacks are real, the wounds are fresh, and the cost of ignoring them is too high.

But hear me: do not project this word onto someone else. Hold the mirror of God's Word to your own soul. Ask yourself honestly: *Is the enemy using envy, gossip, or slander through me to sow confusion in the Body of Christ?*

Before I can confront the spirit of confusion, I've got to put the axe to the root of the tree it's growing out of.

- **Because confusion doesn't just appear out of nowhere—it springs from something deeper.**
- **The fruit may be chaos, but the root is carnality.**
- And unless we deal with the root, the tree will keep bearing rotten fruit. So today, before we break the power of confusion, we must strike at the root of envy, gossip, and slander that feeds it.

Gross Immaturity in the Church - To be quite honest, the root of this is nothing more than gross immaturity in the Body of Christ. The useless drama we stir up is not the Spirit of God—it is our flesh running wild and unchecked. When envy, gossip, and slander dominate our conversations, it is not a mark of spirituality but a sign of extreme immaturity.

The devil doesn't need to attack some churches—they implode under the weight of their own immaturity.

What we call 'spiritual warfare' is often just spiritual childishness.

Confusion: A Demonic Atmosphere

"God is not the author of confusion, but of peace" (1 Corinthians 14:33).

- Confusion is not just a clash of personalities.
- It is not simply human disagreement.
- **Confusion is a spiritual atmosphere — and atmospheres either attract angels or they attract demons.**

The kingdom of darkness feeds on confusion the way flies feed on decay. **Demons cannot survive in an atmosphere of peace, clarity, and truth.** But when strife and disorder are present, they swarm.

James 3:16 unmasks it: “For where envy and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work.”

- That means confusion doesn’t travel alone. It opens the door and invites “every evil work” to rush in — bitterness, division, perversion, deception, witchcraft, even violence.
- **Confusion is the gateway drug of the demonic realm.**
- **Think about it: God’s throne is established on righteousness and order. Heaven is harmony. But hell is built on distortion, deception, and division. Satan cannot create — he can only corrupt. His kingdom survives by twisting truth, sowing lies, and disrupting order. And when confusion fills the air, demons find their home.**

The Babel Principle - Look at the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11). Humanity had one language and one purpose. Even though their goal was evil, God Himself declared: *“Nothing they propose to do will be withheld from them.”* Why? Because they were unified. God judged them by introducing confusion, scattering their speech.

Here’s the revelation: **Unity releases power in the spirit realm — for good or for evil!** That’s why hell does everything it can to fracture it.

- **Confusion is Satan’s counterfeit of Pentecost.** At Pentecost, God unified languages through the Spirit’s fire; at Babel, He confused language to halt rebellion.
- Today, Satan still uses confusion to scatter God’s people, stop kingdom progress, and silence heaven’s voice in the earth.

Revelation on the Spirit Realm

- **Demons are territorial** - They cannot operate where order and truth are established. But when confusion comes, the hedge is broken, and unclean spirits swarm in.

- **Confusion clouds discernment** - When people are caught in confusion, they cannot hear God clearly. Prophetic vision becomes blurred, prayer becomes hindered, and decisions become compromised.
- **Confusion multiplies voices** - Where God has one voice, hell has many. Confusion fills the air with competing sounds — opinions, accusations, suspicions — until no one knows what truth is. That's when “every evil work” takes root.
- **Confusion empowers witchcraft** - Paul asked the Galatians, “*Who has bewitched you?*” (Galatians 3:1). Witchcraft operates through manipulation, control, and disorder — and it thrives in confusion.

Confusion is not neutral — it is spiritual fuel for the demonic. Hell feeds on confusion; heaven flows through unity.

The atmosphere you create determines the spirit you attract.

The Three Weapons of Confusion

1. The Poison of Envy

- Jealousy says, “*I want what you have.*” Envy says, “*I don't want you to have it.*”

- Cain murdered Abel out of envy (Genesis 4:4–5).
- Joseph’s brothers sold him for the same reason (Genesis 37:11).
- The priests delivered Jesus to Pilate because of envy (Mark 15:10).

Envy turns brothers into betrayers.

2. The Venom of Gossip

Proverbs 26:20: “Where there is no wood, the fire goes out; and where there is no talebearer, strife ceases.”

- Gossip is the tinder of division.
- It is not harmless chatter—it is hell’s whisper campaign.
- One whisper can undo years of trust, ruin relationships, and fracture fellowship.

Gossip is the devil’s intercom system, and one whisper of gossip can undo a thousand sermons!

- **Gossip spreads suspicion, and suspicion is the soil where lying spirits thrive.**

3. The Sword of Slander

- If gossip is a whisper, slander is a shout. Gossip may repeat lies, but slander twists the truth.
- The very name *diabolos* means “slanderer.”
- To slander is to speak Satan’s native tongue.

Psalm 101:5 warns: “Whoever secretly slanders his neighbor, him I will destroy.”

- *Slander is not a small sin—it is the devil’s language. When you slander, you speak fluent Satan.*
- Slander is more than an attack on reputation — it is agreement with the Accuser of the brethren, empowering his voice in the earth.

The Mouth: The Devil’s Microphone - Envy, gossip, and slander all require one instrument: the human mouth.

- Heaven advances through confession, prayer, and prophecy. Hell advances through gossip, lies, and slander.
- Our mouths are either trumpets for truth or microphones for demons.
- That’s why James says bitter and sweet water cannot flow from the same fountain. When we speak

confusion, we are not just wounding people — we are empowering principalities.

- *Your tongue is either a weapon in God's hand or a tool in Satan's mouth.*

The words you release determine the spirits you attract. Loose lips don't just sink ships — they open gates.

The Call to Unity Beloved, unity is not optional. It is the fortress wall that keeps demons out. It is the spiritual greenhouse where the presence of God flourishes.

- At Pentecost, God poured out His Spirit on a people who were “with one accord in one place.” Unity drew heaven down.
- The early Church shook empires, not because they had better strategies, but because they refused to allow division to fracture them.
- *Unity is the atmosphere of revival.*
- **Where brethren dwell in unity, the oil flows and the enemy flees. (Psalm 133)**

It is time to shut the door to confusion. Reject envy. Refuse gossip. Renounce slander. Check your spirit and then check your lips.

The choice is ours:

- Confusion or clarity.
- Division or unity.
- Satan's foothold or God's stronghold.
- Open heavens or closed heavens.

Final Declaration: *Confusion feeds demons — unity attracts glory. Shut the door to confusion and watch the windows of heaven open over your life, your family, and your church!*

Repentance prayer: “Lord, forgive me for every word, every thought, every action that partnered with confusion. Wash my lips. Wash my heart. Wash my spirit.”

Renunciation: “I renounce envy, gossip, and slander. They will not rule my life. My tongue belongs to the Spirit of God.”

Declaration: “From this day forward, my mouth will be a trumpet of truth, not a microphone for hell!”

Have people turn to someone near them, take them by the hand, and declare: “I will fight for you, not against

you. I will cover you, not expose you. I will stand in unity with you.”

Read Psalm 133 aloud together: “How good and pleasant it is when brethren dwell together in unity...”

Then declare: “Lord, release the oil of unity over this house! Let confusion be broken, let peace reign, and let revival flow!”
