James 1:2-4—Maturing through trails

James 1:2–4 (ESV) ² Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, ³ for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. ⁴ And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.

2 KEYS TO MATURE FROM TRIALS (2-4)

1.	CONSIDER IT ALL JOY	(2-3)
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Trials are defined as being put into a difficult circumstance, but just going through the trial does not necessarily result in a spiritual benefit. Knowing that trials are inevitable, how are you preparing now to face a trial in a manner that would aim to mature spiritually?

What are you hoping would and wouldn't be exposed in a trial?

Have you wasted the opportunity to mature through a trial in the past? If God provided the opportunity for you to grow, what caused you to waste the trial?

What causes you to resist the timing, duration, or specifics of a trial now?

2. CONSENT TO THE PROCESS (4)

God in fact does want to do a work in your life when you are in trails. What are some passages that have helped shape your steadfastness (patience/endurance) in a trial?	
What temptations do you face before, during, and after a trial?	
As we understand all people face trials and temptations, what causes us to isolate ourselve from other brothers and sisters in Christ?	S
Where do you value personal comforts more than growing in character?	
What are some unbiblical ways you have been taught to respond to a trial?
